### A New Year

"If then you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth. For you have died, and your life is hidden with

Christ in God. When Christ who is your life appears, then you also will appear with him in glory.

Put to death therefore what is earthly in you: sexual immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and covetousness which is idolatry. On account of these the wrath of God is coming. In these you too once walked, when you were living in them. But now you must put them all away: anger, wrath, malice, slander, and obscene talk from your mouth. Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have put off the old self with its practices and have put on the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge after the image of its creator. Here there is not Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave, free; but Christ is all, and in all.

Put on then, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, compassionate hearts, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience, bearing with one another and, if one has a complaint against another, forgiving each other; as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. And above all these put on love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in one body. And be thankful. Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God. And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him." Colossians 3:1-17 (ESV)

As we start the new year, I want to allow God and His Word to be the first ones to guide and shape us. So please, don't just skim through the Word, but take your time and read through it slowly, meditate on it again and again throughout the coming days, weeks, and months and allow God to mold you through it.





## Wednesdays Youth Group

### **Mission Moment**

On January 22, 1984, President Ronald Reagan issued a presidential proclamation designating the third Sunday of January as National Sanctity of Human Life Day. Pastors, churches and life organizations across the United States use this day to bring awareness to the attacks that are daily waged against human life through the abortion industry.

One of the best ways we can protect unborn lives is by bringing into the light the darkness of abortion, and supporting local pregnancy help organizations who daily reach women and fami-

lies with messages of hope and life. AHCC supports the Alpha Center in Sioux Falls with a monthly donation. The Alpha Center is a non-profit agency that provides a wide range of services to women and men involved in an unexpected pregnancy. Their goal is to provide positive alternatives with practical support.

Their free services include pregnancy tests and private consultations, ultrasound exams, mentoring for both mothers and fathers, parenting classes, weekly life skills classes and post-abortion support. They also offer an education-based program called Earn While You Learn, in which clients watch videos applicable to their stage of pregnancy through their child's first two years and then earn incentive points that can be redeemed for baby items like diapers, car seats, clothing, bottles, etc. It's important to teach clients new skills and empower them to apply those skills to their life as opposed to just giving things away. They want them to learn how to be good parents and make positive changes in their life.

At the Alpha Center, they help people through the initial panic of an unplanned pregnancy, but also hope that a relationship with a client will transition from just needs-based material assistance to fostering changes for a better life and a desire for a relationship with Christ. Those conversations do not always come easily, but they hope to see a change in a client's life and be there for people when they are ready. Please keep Alpha Center in your prayers.
