resolutions



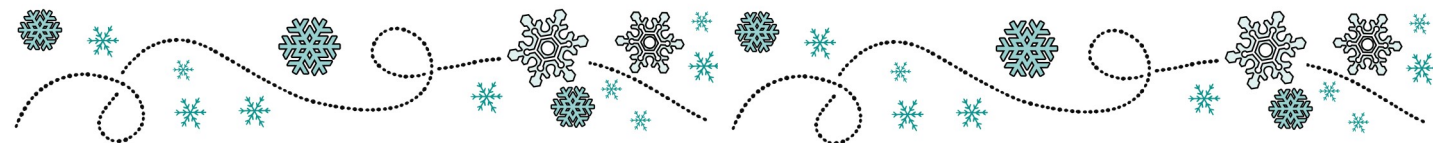
Our culture tells us that it's okay to hate those who disagree with you, saying, "They are your enemy and they are less than you, so it doesn't matter how you treat them." The culture doesn't come out and say this, but it's seen in the actions we consider

acceptable such as cutting people out of our lives for having a different opinion, calling people terrible names, mocking them and treating them as idiots or worse. There is hostility in the world, in the culture, but Jesus brings hostility to an end. Ephesians 2:11-18 reads,

"Therefore remember that at one time you Gentiles in the flesh, called 'the uncircumcision' by what is called the circumcision, which is made in the flesh by hands—remember that you were at that time separated from Christ, alienated from the commonwealth of Israel and strangers to the covenants of promise, having no hope and without God in the world. But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ. For he himself is our peace, who has made us both one and has broken down in his flesh the dividing wall of hostility by abolishing the law of commandments expressed in ordinances, that he might create in himself one new man in place of two, so making peace, and might reconcile us both to God in one body through the cross, thereby killing the hostility. And he came and preached peace to you who were far off and peace to those who were near. For through him we both have access in one Spirit to the Father."

In the New Testament, there might not be a more disparate pair than Jews and Gentiles. The Jews had the covenants and promises, the Gentiles did not. There was intense hostility between the two with both sides fighting against each other in various ways. But Paul tells us that God has brought that hostility to an end through Jesus. Through Jesus, God has created one people out of Jews and Gentiles bringing peace between each other, but most importantly between all people and Himself. How was this accomplished? Through the death of Jesus on the cross, God has brought and offered redemption and reconciliation to all. So as we continue to live in a hostile culture, let us be like our Savior and Lord, standing firmly on the truths of God, yet sowing peace through the Good News of Jesus.

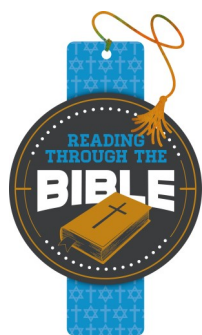

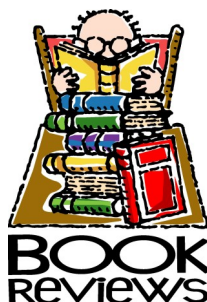

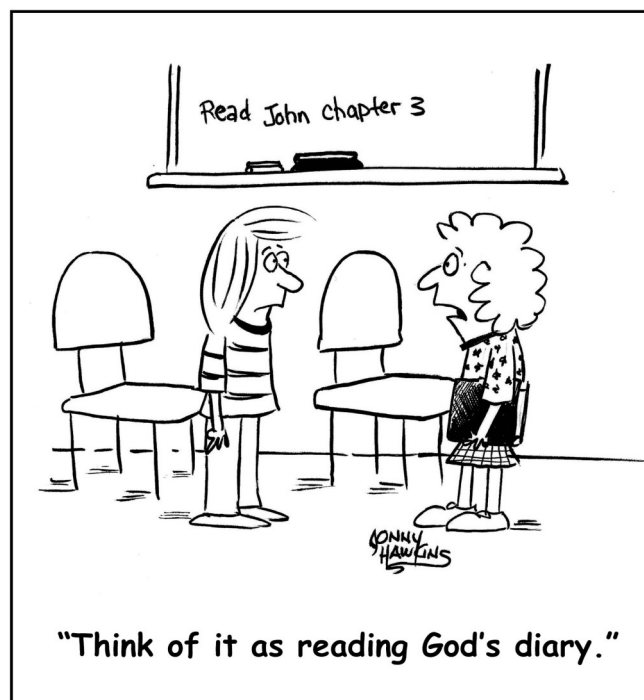
The Women of the Bible Speak by Shannon Bream
