We are deeply grateful for the leadership and partnership of these churches. Their ongoing support plays a vital role in shaping our mission and community.




- Of our 80 global missionaries, 27 attended or graduated SBC.

- Currently serving as Director of Next Generation for the EM Conference.







Tuesday Evenings: Sept. 9 - Dec. 2

Have you ever found yourself in a position to help someone through a difficult situation and yet struggled with knowing what to say or even how to say it?

SBC is now offering the Introduction to Counselling course on Tuesday evenings to make it accessible for everyone who wishes to gain strength in their people skills and feel more confident in knowing how to help. You will learn basic counselling concepts in both theory and practice based on biblical truth and scientific evidence, such as: practical body language, developing good questions, Cognitive Behavioral Therapy and pastoral counselling. This is an invite for pastors, youth workers, caregivers, parents or mentors who wish to expand their knowledge and increase their effectiveness in people care.

Two Views on Christian Zionism

THURSDAY EVENINGS: SEPT. 18 - OCT. 2 AND WEDNESDAY EVENING: OCTOBER 8

Did God give modern Israel to the Jews?

That is the subtitle of Steinbach Bible College's upcoming fall course, Two Views on Christian Zionism. This course will explore two different views on Christian Zionism. As part of this process, students will learn about the history of Israel and of the Zionist movement, evaluate the biblical and theological arguments for and against Christian Zionism, and consider how Christians should respond to the current Israel/Palestine controversy.

By the end of this course, students will better understand how Christians from different perspectives think about Israel and Zionism. Regardless of one's personal view on this topic, the goal is that students will come out of this course equipped to think critically about this challenging issue.

The course is taught by Michael Zwaagstra, a long-time instructor at SBC. Michael has many years of experience helping students navigate challenging theological topics.
