Discussion Questions:

- 4. We have a responsibility to give mutual love and support to each other. Is this only for our inner circle of people or should we feel a sense of responsibility even to strangers? How does God give us opportunities for this?
- 5. We have a responsibility to avoid behaviors that harm. Do you think we've become blind to how our behavior negatively impacts others? How is this mindset loving rather than legalism?
- 6. We are responsible to rescue those who cannot rescue themselves. Read Proverbs 24 and discuss the implications of these verses. Where do we see people stumbling towards slaughter today? Where does our responsibility lie?
