1. Understanding should be the goal of communication

Proverbs 18:2 "Fools have no interest in understanding; they only want to air their own opinions." (*NLT=New Living Translation*)

Ecclesiastes 5:3 "Too much activity gives you restless dreams; too many words make you a fool." (NLT) James 1:19 "Understand this, my dear brothers and sisters: You must all be quick to listen, slow to speak, and slow to get angry." (NLT)

Proverbs 13:3 "Those who control their tongue will have a long life; (and a long marriage) *opening your mouth can ruin everything." (NLT)*

Proverbs 15:4 "Gentle words are a tree of life; a deceitful **tongue** crushes the spirit." (NLT) Ephesians 4:29 "Let no corrupting talk come out of your mouths, but only such as is good for building up, as fits the occasion, that it may give grace to those who hear." (ESV=English Standard Version)
