We are excited to share some updates with you from the clothing pantry crew.

Who is the crew?

What is the clothing pantry?

We have basic clothing for men, women and children in need. They do not need a referral but are allowed to come twice a year to get seasonal

When does this happen?

Every Wednesday from 1-2:30.

Where is the clothing pantry?

It is in Martin Hall in the old parlor.

How did these missions start?

Recognizing the need for free clothing for individuals living below the poverty line, Donna Brunner initiated the Clad Tidings ministry to provide essential garments to men, women, and children. Nancy Harvey collaborated with the prison to launch Start Fresh, a program dedicated to providing clothing for men reentering society after incarceration.

Over the past four months, our clothing pantry has provided essential garments to more than 100 individuals. If you know of anyone in need of clothing, please let them know as we are eager to help! If you know someone facing an emergency need, reach out to Jan Harrell. We will gladly arrange for two clothing pantry workers to assist them during this critical time. 






FROMTHE HERITAGE ARCHIVES: TIRED OF CHANGE?

Changes in our name, our buildings, our membership, our pastors, our leaders, and our programs have kept the light of Christ shining for 170 years.

Take a look at the year: 1908.

- 1908 M. L. Moore retired after serving as Clerk of Session for 40 years and Elder for 49 years
- 1908 Chalmers C. Marquis elected Clerk of Session. He served **26** years. **Jan. 28, 1908** Our Rev.
- Frederick Hawley led a ministerial group to sponsor a Billy Sunday revival in Bloomington that reached more than 4,000 people. **108** new members were received at Second Presbyterian Church, with others



Billy Shelper attended the revival meeting and dedicated his "life to God and the service of others' and he vowed to quit drinking. He was as good as his word. He joined Second Presbyterian Church and served several years as an elder. By 1917, he had organized The Bloomington City Rescue Mission, now known as Home Sweet Home Mission today.

Feb. 8, 1908 Men's Brotherhood Bible Class organized. Dr. Jay Whitefield teaches class 21 years (1908-1929)

directory planned. Free pews are discussed.
Mar. 9, 1908 George J. Mecherle, founder of State

Farm Insurance, joined the church.

Mar. 22, 1908 Congregation voted 151 yes and 316 no on the question, "Shall we continue to meet the expenses of the church by the present system of pew rentals?"

Apr. 1908 Annual Report is typed. Additions to the committee reports: Boys Club, Brotherhood Bible Study, **Temperance**, and Auditing. **4** employees listed: Pastor, Chorister (Assistant to the Pastor), janitor, and organist.

Apr. 1908 By-Laws and Constitution changes approved with all members voting. Annual meeting changed to first Monday in April. Nine trustees serve 3-year terms, seven Deacons serve 7-year terms, an indefinite number of elders serve indefinite terms.

Apr. 1908 First Brokaw Hospital Trustees elected:
Mr. H. A. Soper and Mr. F. Y. Hamilton
July 8, 1908 Mr. Scrogin from the Anti-Saloon
League invited to speak from pulpit
Sep. 27, 1908 Rally Day for Sunday School held.
Dec. 27, 1908 Handel's "Messiah" presented to

community. Cost covered by collection: \$72.

From dedicated lay and ordained leadership to support of the Freedmen's Bureau to hosting the Anti-Saloon League to creating multiple musical groups, to forming a Robotics Ministry, 2PC continues to be relevant in the community and in its members' lives.

FINANCIAL UPDATE

Financial Summary through June 30, 2025 - Actuals compared to the Prorated Budget

Contributions are favorable compared to the prorated budget by \$29,728. Other Receipts are favorable, being \$60,305 greater than the prorated budget and include \$80,516 transferred from Foundation for the door repairs and sanctuary caulk repairs. Additionally, during the first six months of the year \$100,000 of the budgeted Foundation support was needed to support church operations. Expenses are unfavorable as they are \$102,819 greater than the prorated budget and include \$33,125 spent to fix the Prairie Street and Jefferson Street doors and \$47,391 spent to repair the caulk around the sanctuary stone. This provides a \$7,203 favorable variance for the first six months of 2025. The 2025 annual budget includes a \$51,214 deficit.

As of April 7th, the church collected 145 stewardship cards totaling \$885,009. Stewardship Sunday is Sunday, September 7th. More information to follow.
