

# WEEK OF 11.03.25 DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

#### **SERMON SUMMARY**

Throughout history, God has repeatedly reformed His people—calling them back to His Word and reigniting His Church through the power of the Holy Spirit. From **The** Reformation to modern movements of revival, every season of renewal begins the same way: with ordinary believers who are desperate for God to move. In Acts 19, the gospel collides with a culture filled with idols. Yet amid the chaos, God reforms hearts, brings repentance, and magnifies the name of Jesus. The same Spirit who moved in Ephesus is still moving today—and God is calling us not just to watch but to participate.

### **EXPECTING OPPOSITION.** READ ACTS 19:13-16

- The demons said, "Jesus I know, and Paul I recognize, but who are you?" What does that teach us about spiritual warfare?
- Pastor Chase asked, "Does the enemy know your name?" How does this make you feel? What would it look like for your faith to be a threat to darkness?

### **REPENTANCE THAT COSTS SOMETHING. READ ACTS 19:17–20**

• What might be the "books" or "idols" we need to burn in our own lives?

• Why do you think genuine repentance is such a catalyst for reformation in a community?

### STEPPING OUT OF COMFORT.

- Why do you think reformation never happens in the comfort zone?
- What forms of comfort (habits, approval, convenience, politics, control) can keep us from fully following Jesus?
- What does it practically look like to choose obedience over comfort in your daily life?

### FOR THE GLORY OF GOD ALONE. READ ACTS 19:17 AGAIN

- In what ways does God's glory—not our success—define true revival?
- How can we ensure that any "wins" or growth in our families, home group, and church always point people back to Jesus?
