SERMON SUMMARY

This week's sermon focused on the church's role and purpose. Drawing from 1 Peter 2, Pastor Chase highlighted the church's purpose to be driven by the Word of God and to magnify His glory. The sermon also discussed the distinctives of the church as one, holy, Christian, and apostolic, and the importance of baptism as a symbol of the inward reality of salvation.
