




God speaks to us in scripture reading, preaching, and song.

▼Children's Message

▼First Reading: Isaiah 9:2-7

Isaiah addresses these words to the parts of Israel that were particularly close to foreign powers and to trade routes, and therefore particularly vulnerable to invasion and oppression. These people are especially in need of assurance that God's promises of safety and of a strong, protective ruler would be fulfilled.

² The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness—on them light has shined. ³ You have multiplied exultation; you have increased its joy; they rejoice before you as with joy at the harvest, as people exult when dividing plunder. ⁴ For the yoke of their burden and the bar across their shoulders, the rod of their oppressor, you have broken as on the day of Midian. ⁵ For all the boots of the tramping warriors and all the garments rolled in blood shall be burned as fuel for the fire. ⁶ For a child has been born for us, a son given to us; authority rests upon his shoulders, and he is named Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. ⁷ Great will be his authority, and there shall be endless peace for the throne of David and his kingdom. He will establish and uphold it with justice and with righteousness from this time onward and forevermore. The zeal of the LORD of hosts will do this.

▼Second Reading: Titus 2:11-14

In the book of Titus, the apostle encourages the young church to hold fast to the faith, avoid behavior that would needlessly offend outsiders, and live at unity with each other. He grounds this behavior in God's grace shown in the Incarnation of Jesus.

¹¹ The grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation to all, ¹² training us to renounce impiety and worldly passions and in the present age to live lives that are self-controlled, upright, and godly, ¹³ while we wait for the blessed hope and the manifestation of the glory of our great God and Savior, Jesus Christ. ¹⁴ He it is who gave himself for us that he might redeem us from all iniquity and purify for himself a people of his own who are zealous for good deeds.

▲Gospel: Luke 2:1-20

Luke describes how God arranges things to mesh with the divine intention. An edict involving the whole empire forces Joseph and Mary to have their child in Bethlehem (David's home town) rather than Nazareth. The child is laid in a manger, where the shepherds find him, bringing an end to Isaiah's complaint: "the donkey knows its master's crib; but Israel does not know, my people do not understand." (1:3)

The Holy Gospel according to Luke the 2nd chapter. Glory to you, O Lord.

¹ In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be registered. ² This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. ³ All went to their own towns to be registered. ⁴ Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. ⁵ He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth and laid him in a manger, because there was no place in the guest room.8 Now in that same region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. ⁹ Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. ¹⁰ But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid, for see, I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: 11 to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord. ¹² This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger." ¹³ And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying, ¹⁴ "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favors!" ¹⁵ When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go now to Bethlehem and see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us." 16 So they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph and the child lying in the manger. ¹⁷ When they saw this, they made known what had been told them about this child, ¹⁸ and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds told them, ¹⁹ and Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart. ²⁰ The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, just as it had been told them.






▲ Offering Prayer


▲Great Thanksgiving


Gathered into one by the Holy Spirit, let us pray as Jesus taught us.

If you cannot receive one element of this meal, please be assured that Christ is fully present in both the bread and the wine. If you desire to receive communion in the pew, please alert an usher. Those not communing (adults and children) are welcome to come forward for a blessing. Please fill out the white communion envelope and place it in the offering plate or give it to an usher so that we have record of your presence on this Holy Night.

Our sending hymn and traditional recessional for the 6:00pm service and the 8:00pm service will differ.

<u>6:00pm:</u> The recessional will be traditional. As we sing the hymn, the Crucifer and Acolytes, Choir, Liturgical Deacons, Pastor Jason, and Pastor Jess will recess to the entrance of the church and the Dismissal will follow.

8:00pm: We will conclude our service in candlelight. Prior to singing of our hymn, the procedure to light your individual candles is this: From the center candle of the Advent Wreath, the minister will light a large candle, which symbolizes Christ, the Light of the world. The Deacons, Acolytes, and Ushers will light their candles from the minister's candle and then light the candle of each worshiper nearest the aisle.

The lighted candle is never tilted, but is always held upright when sharing the light to another. You will tilt your candle to receive the flame.

As we sing the hymn, the Crucifer, Acolytes, Liturgical Deacons, Pastor Jason, and Pastor Jess will recess to the entrance of the church and the Dismissal will follow.

Please extinguish your candle before leaving your pew.
