OUR ADVENT THEME: EVERY HEART PREPARE

"Prepare!" is often the watchword of the season as the world gets ready for another celebration of Christmas. An integral part of any preparation is decoration. We see decorations everywhere this time of year. The world may not comprehend the real meaning of Christmas, but even secular preparations use many of the same decorations beloved by Christians—an appropriation we shouldn't mind at all, because these decorations point us to Christ. This year, as we look forward again to the coming of the Messiah, we take a fresh look at how the adornments of the season draw our eyes to Jesus, that we may more richly behold the love, peace, joy, and hope He comes to bring as this beauty is set before us.

MIDWEEK OF ADVENT 1 (DEC. 3) - EVERGREENS

Evergreens—from Christmas trees to pine garland, from holly to mistletoe—are often part of our holiday decorations. The evergreen decorations help us prepare for the advent (coming) of Jesus during Advent, a season of preparation. Together we will consider how trees—particularly evergreens—have been a focal point of God's creative and redemptive activities for His people, pointing us to the coming of Christ and the everlasting life He brings.

MIDWEEK OF ADVENT 2 (DEC. 10) - LIGHTS

Our Advent and Christmas decoration preparation frequently includes using lights. From Advent candles to strings of twinkling Christmas tree lights, these luminous decorations help us prepare for the advent (coming) of Jesus during Advent because they remind us of Christ, who says, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows Me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life" (John 8:12). As a result of the light He gives, He also says to His baptized disciples, "You are the light of the world" (Matthew 5:14), and He uses us to reflect His light to others.

MIDWEEK OF ADVENT 3 (DEC. 17) - CRÈCHE

As we prepare for Christmas, our decoration preparation may include the crèche—the model of the nativity scene. The crèche is a distinctively Christian decoration in that it depicts the characters who

were involved in the nativity and early life of Christ: Mary, Joseph, the shepherds, the Wise Men, the angels, the stable animals, and—most important of all—baby Jesus. The manger scene reminds us of the timeless narrative of God's coming to earth as a baby to redeem us from our sins. The crèche also reminds us of what we learn in the Bible and drives us there to find Jesus, as Martin Luther says: "Here you will find the swaddling cloths and the manger in which Christ lies, and to which the angel points the shepherds [Luke 2:12]. Simple and lowly are these swaddling cloths, but dear is the treasure, Christ, who lies in them" (E. Theodore Bachmann and Helmut T. Lehmann, ed., Luther's Works [Fortress Press, 1960], 35:236.).

CHRISTMAS EVE - THE NATIVITY OF OUR LORD - WRAPPED PRESENTS

We decorate for Christmas. Our decorations include wrapped presents—gifts in colorful boxes and bags that are placed under the Christmas tree. But these gifts all pale in comparison to the gift that started it all at Christmas—the gift of God's Son, whose birth brings us regeneration, renewal, and eternal life. On Christmas [Eve], we consider how the gifts under the tree point us to God's indescribable gift in Jesus Christ.

A Look Forward to 2026

St. Matthew Lutheran Church's 135th Anniversary

The year 2026 marks an exciting year for St. Matthew Lutheran Church. It is our 135th Anniversary! Now 135 years may not seem like a milestone year for many of you but, for me it is a true blessing from God and a display of 135 years of faithfulness and something worth celebrating.

St. Matthew Lutheran Church's Beginnings

The Rev. Robert Gaiser, the founding pastor of St. Matthew Lutheran Church, came from St. Paul's Lutheran Church, Rost Township, Jackson County. Together with E.L. Schwartz he located ten Lutheran families of German heritage in the Worthington Area and conducted the first service for St. Matthews in a meeting hall above a shoe store on Worthington's 10th Street. That was on January 4th, 1891.

That's nearly 135 years ago. How did he get to Worthington in January 1891? Must have been by horse and buggy on a typical Worthington winter's day (probably windy and cold). How are we going to celebrate this milestone?

It was back in 1991, the 100th Anniversary year, the evergreen tree on the west side of our current church building was planted to celebrate the year by Dale Behrens and Alvin Sachen. Looking at it today, it has grown into a beautiful tree. Now you know it's story. What would your story be?

A Walk Thru the Old Testament - Teaching the Big Picture of the Old Testament

Many believers are confused about the Old Testament--what it says, what it means, how to apply it to daily life. Some may wonder if it is even relevant today. Others are overwhelmed by it and don't know how to read it. Would-be Bible readers often quit before they make it all the way through the Old Testament.

What if there was an event that could actually inspire people to read the Bible? What if there was an event that made the Old Testament come alive in a fun, clear, and very memorable way?

St. Matthew Lutheran Church will be hosting such an event on Saturday, January 10th from 9:00am -12:30pm (includes a lunch), where a certified Walk Thru the Old Testament (otLive) instructor will be leading us in a fun and exciting event that teaches the big picture of the Old Testament. Attendees will learn the major events and people of the Old Testament and understand its storyline, maybe for the first time.

This event is for anyone 5th Grade through Adult. The Confirmation Classes (5th-8th Graders) and their parents will be strongly encouraged to attend. It will also be open to anyone in the community or surrounding area who would like to attend.

Walk Thru the Bible Ministry has been teaching the big story of the Bible for more than 40 years. Millions of people all around the world have experienced a Walk Thru the Bible live event. Here's what we've discovered: more important than just teaching information, it will also ignite passion for reading God's Word. After attending, a whopping 75% of participants commit to daily Bible reading!

We know that God's Word changes everything. It contains the answers to the challenges that we face today. So, reserve a spot on your calendar for Saturday, January 10th. From personal testimony, as your pastor, what you take away from this event will stay with you for many years. Watch your weekly bulletins for more details.

Sunday, January 25th – Re:Vitality Strategic Planning Begins

Our congregation is vital — it has life. There is vitality wherever God's Word is proclaimed in purity and the Lord's Sacraments are rightly administered. This Christ-centered vitality is the focus of *re:Vitality*, a collection of resources developed by the Office of National Mission to help equip our congregation for carrying out God's mission here in Worthington, MN.

The *re:Vitality* collection of resources includes practical and productive workshops that address serving our inactive members called "Shepherding Our Strays", consensus-based strategic planning for our congregation called "Serving in God's Mission", and how to share the Gospel with your community through effective outreach called "Connect to Disciple". *Re:Vitality* resources are available to LCMS congregations at no cost from the Office of National Mission.

On Sunday, January 25th, between our Worship Services, we will begin with a Congregational Assessment of Development/Decline Status (CADDS). This Assessment is a survey-based self-assessment tool that relies on input from people within our congregation to evaluate our congregation's well-being.

CADDS uses a scientifically-developed 95-question survey to measure three critical elements of congregational well-being: sustainability, adaptability, and balance of outward-inward focus. As we begin a new year and as we look toward the next 5 years of ministry and beyond, this tool may be just what we have been looking for to help guide us with a stronger sense of direction and purpose.

For this to be successful we need you, all the members of St. Matthew Lutheran Church, active and not so active, to be giving your input. This input will start with a survey that will initially be delivered on Sunday, January 25th between Services. The Survey must be completed within 2 weeks of January 25th (that makes the final deadline to have your surveys turned in on Sunday, February 8^{th}).

I'm excited for this opportunity to move forward with you in the spreading of the Gospel of Jesus Christ here at St. Matthew Lutheran. Let's together see where God is leading us.



<u>Treasurer</u>: April 1 to September 30, 2025, Income was \$227,831.11 with expenses of \$233,211.70. This left the congregation a shortage of \$5,380.59. Other September 30 balances include: Memorial Fund \$27,492.07; Youth Account \$18,338.34; Momentum One (Scholarship) \$808,299.32; Momentum Two \$321,462.48. Expenses for DCE Intern, Naomi Vang totaled \$40,930.63 and Momentum One covered \$27,000 of this and remaining cost of \$13,930.63 was paid by the church. <u>Staff Reports</u>: *Pastor Hahn* – The six-month service attendance average was 173, previous six-month average was 190. YouTube views remain constant. Did 36 services, 83 visitations, several Bible study groups and meetings, Circuit Pastor Conferences, and National Youth Gathering. Encourage members

to volunteer to be involved with church activities. Thank you to staff, all volunteers, and to God for the blessings that St. Matthew Lutheran Church has received. Roxie – All groups continue to meet and are going well. Parent Sunday School has started and have been receiving good comments. Mom's Group has changed their name to Moms and Jesus' Lil Lambs. Confirmation is going well. Lorenda – Thanks to willingness of people to serve and share their talents. We need more people to do this. Please consider lending a hand. We are blessed to have an adult and bell choir and are thankful as so many churches no longer have any choirs. Alexie & David - Sunday & Wednesday youth attendance has been around 13-15 regularly attending. Mission trip will be to Luther Valley Ranch in Woodland, CO. Elders: Thank you to Elders that are serving. Encourage anyone to use the suggestion box. We appreciate any comments/concerns. Will be doing a "Vitality" congregational survey after the holidays. This will help identify what the needs and goals of our church are for the future. Trustees: New furnaces and air conditioners for the Sanctuary are completed. Working on balcony floor and sound system project. Will check on the ventilation in the youth room. Board of Education: VBS went great this year with doing a half day and our own programming. Thank you to everyone that helped. Sunday school is averaging 60-70 kids. Current Business: 2026 Operating Budget was presented. Members raised no discussion. New Business: Basement carpet replacement was requested by LWML members. Stains keep coming back after it has been cleaned in the past. Trustees stated these stains are coming up from below when we get water seepage with heavy rainfall. Trustees received a bid of \$22,000 to replace the carpet.

Carpet is best for replacement instead of other flooring due to the occasional water seepage in some areas. A committee will be formed to decide on best carpet option and not to exceed cost of \$30,000. Pastor Hahn informed voters that in 2026 St. Matthews will be 135 years old.

Next Bi-Annual Voters Meeting will be held on April 26, 2026, with time to be determined.

HIGHLIGHTS from the November 10, 2025, Council Meeting:

Treasurer's Report: October income was \$40,977.69, with expenses of \$33,486.12, leaving the General Fund at \$122,102.33 Other balances: Youth \$11,919.44; Momentum One (Scholarship) \$811,011.77; Momentum Two \$323,486.12; and Memorial Fund \$27,842.07.

Staff Reports: Pastor – Averaged worship attendance was 87 for 8am and 115 for 10:15am. 11 services performed, 16 visitations, 4 baptisms, several meetings. Listed the upcoming worship services and times, and upcoming January event. Struggle to find enough volunteer tech people for services. *Roxie* – Widows group had 3 new attendees from the community join this month. Moms group is trying a new format. Health Cabinet did a presentation on suicide at Noon Fellowship. Lorenda – Organ tuning will be scheduled for spring. Choir and Sanctuary pianos will be tuned in December. Sunday School youth doing well with their songs for Christmas program. Planning Advent and Christmas services. Alexie & David – youth attendance remains good. Mission trip being planned. Cookie dough fundraiser made a profit of \$1,000. Will be selling apples from the orchard soon. Elders: Will be sending out postcards to every household about upcoming Advent & Christmas services. Posted request for anyone interested in being an Usher and have received a few new names. Trustees: Lights have been mounted in archway, but not all have been finished being wired yet. Have had the current internet connections checked and some are weak. We received an estimate on replacing our current system. Trustees suggest proceeding with the replacement to correct some of our problems. Board of Education: Christmas program songs are going well.

Ministry Planning: Advent meals this year. Will ask for people to plan, cook, and serve. Council will do the December 3rd meals. Will decorate the church for Christmas on December 29th at 8:30 a.m. New Business: Will arrange for a safety training with police department in February. Pastor mentioned the 135th anniversary of our church in 2026, and everyone should talk to members/groups to see if there is interest in organizing anything.
