PASTOR HAHN'S ARTICLE - Jesus is Lord!

Can you guess at how many names and titles are given to the Lord Jesus Christ in the Bible? I have heard that there are over a hundred names and titles given to our blessed Savior! A few of these include: Advocate, Author, Bread of Life, Captain of Salvation, Chief Shepherd, Creator, Dayspring, Elect of God, Forerunner, Governor, Great High Priest, Head of the Church, Immanuel, Judge, King of Kings, Lord of Lords, Lamb of God, etc. As one ponders this long list of names and titles, we begin to understand more fully who Jesus really is, and that in the Lord Jesus Christ we have everything.

Have you ever been driving down the interstate and noticed the billboard that reads, "Jesus is Lord!"? Well, "Jesus" means Savior and "Lord" means one in authority, ruler, the head, supreme, one who has power, one in charge. There is no question about it, JESUS IS LORD. He Himself declares: "I am the Lord, that is my name." (Isaiah 42:8.

Ponder what the following Scripture passages tell us about the Lord...

- "But the Lord is the true God; he is the living God and the everlasting King. At his wrath, the earth quakes, and the nations cannot endure his indignation." (Jeremiah 10:10)
- "Lord, you have been our dwelling place in all generations. Before the mountains were brought forth, or ever you had formed the earth and the world, from everlasting to everlasting you are God." (Psalm 90:1-2)
- "For I the Lord do not change; therefore you, O children of Jacob, are not consumed. (Malachi 3:6)
- "...Lord, You know all things..." (John 21:17)

The fact that the Lord knows all things is quite a warning for us. We can't get by with anything. He knows and sees all. But at the same time, what wonderful comfort and strength for us! He knows when our heart aches. He counts the tears that fall on our pillow at night. Nothing is hidden from Him. What is more, He is everywhere present at one and the same time.

Jesus, who is Lord, is gracious, showing undeserved kindness and forgiveness. "The Lord, the Lord God, merciful and gracious, long-suffering, and abundant in goodness and truth, keeping mercy for thousands, forgiving iniquity and transgression and sin." (Exodus 34:6-7).

Jesus is Lord, which by the way was the first Christian Creed. He is Lord of heaven and earth, Lord of the nations. He is supreme. He is in charge. He rules all things in heaven and earth. He declares, "All power is given to me in heaven and on earth." (Matthew 28:18) And He has relinquished none of His power and authority.

It's so easy to use that name without giving it much thought and consequently we miss so much. For example, when we pray: "Come, Lord Jesus..." "Oh give thanks to the Lord for He is good..." "Now I lay me down to sleep, I pray the Lord..."

With the Psalmist I say, through the power of the Spirit, "Trust in the Lord, and do good; so, you will dwell in the land and enjoy security. Take delight in the Lord, and He will give you the desires of your heart. Commit your way to the Lord, trust in Him, and He will act (Psalm 37:3).

Highlights from the September 8, 2025 Council Meeting

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: August income was \$59,742.81 with expenses of \$41,035.96, leaving the General Fund balance at \$121,281.85. The income included a transfer from Scholarship Fun of \$27,000 for funding the DCE Intern position for the past year, as was set previously. Other 8/31/25 balances were: Youth Account \$15,040.00; Momentum One (Scholarship Fund) \$793,533.51; Momentum Two \$315,036.76; Memorial Fund balance was \$27,367.07.

<u>Staff Reports</u>: *Pastor Hahn*: Average Sunday attendance was 149 for August. Preparing for upcoming Confirmation classes and Early Communion classes for 5th graders. MN South Pastor's Conference is October 5-7. <u>Red Letter Giving Challenge</u> Bible Study starting soon. *Roxie*: Will be having Parent Sunday School each Sunday in the Fireside Room for parents to attend while their children are in class. Parents will have the same lesson as their child so families can discuss it at home. Confirmation prep is completed and volunteers ready to begin on September 24. *Lorenda*: Choir rehearsals will resume on September 24. Continuing to plan Christmas programs for the Sunday School kids.

<u>Elder Report</u>: Discussed Vitality program. Open youth worker position has been filled. Thanksgiving Eve worship service with Volunteer Appreciation Dessert Buffet following the service.

<u>Trustees Report</u>: Have received 2 bids for removal of tree. A decision will be made soon, as would like tree removed before winter. Balcony floor and sound system project hoping to be completed October. <u>Board of Education</u>: Sunday School teachers all have their materials. Changed a couple of rooms around for better traffic flow.

<u>Youth Ministry</u>: Looking for parents and youth to join the Youth Board. Will be looking for an adult Treasurer for the Board.

Old Business: DCE/Youth position: David & Alexie Cross have been hired to fill the open youth position. David will be working with youth in grades 5th-8th and Alexie will be working with 9th-12th. Their position started September 1st.

<u>New Business</u>: Basement carpet issue was discussed with several options mentioned. Discussed need for 2 adults to be given authorization to be signers on the youth checking account.
