Consequences of the Resurrection

Once again, this year on Easter Sunday Christians all over the world gather in worship to celebrate the resurrection of Jesus from the dead. And we should, Christ is Risen! Let's take a few moments and review the consequences of the resurrection of Jesus for believers in Him.

Romans 6:4-5 says: "⁴ We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life. ⁵ For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his." God's Word says your Baptism connects you to the death and resurrection of Jesus and that because Jesus rose from the dead, you as a believer in Jesus will rise from the dead!

1 Thessalonians 4:16 says (talking about the return of Jesus) *"For the Lord Himself will descend from heaven with a cry of command, with the voice of an archangel, and with the sound of the trumpet of God. And the dead in Christ will rise first."* Just like what the Bible says in Romans, 1 Thess. 4 declares the resurrection of believers in Jesus.

As to the question of what our resurrected bodies will be like, Philippians 3:21 says *"He will transform our lowly body to be like His glorious body, by the power that enables Him even to subject all things to Himself."* Jesus has conquered sin and death by His death on the cross and promises that our resurrected bodies will be transformed to be glorious - holy - like Jesus. These are just a few of the Bible passages that speak to the consequences of the death and resurrection of Jesus for believers in Him. He is real. He is your Savior from sin and death. Jesus is for you. Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!

Serve by Reading! (in worship)

Can you read clearly out loud? Would you be willing to serve the Lord and your brothers and sisters in Christ on Sunday morning as a scripture reader at early or late service?
