How do I pray, especially when I don't know what to say?

As Christians, we know that God's Word tells us to pray in all circumstances. Sometimes prayer comes easily and joyful. The words seem to flow from us. Yet, sometimes in our sinfulness we don't feel like praying or we don't know what words to us. For some of us, prayer is something we struggle with in our daily walk with God. In those circumstances when prayer doesn't come easily what do we do? Do we leave the praying to someone else? No!

My advice to people who struggle with prayer or don't know what words to use is simple and two-fold: 1) Read/Pray the Psalms. The Psalms cover a great variety of topics. One of them is bound to apply. 2) This is even easier - pray the Lord's Prayer. Don't overthink things. Pray the Lord's Prayer because Jesus gave us this prayer and it can be used in any circumstance.

Martin Luther has a great quote about the Lord's Prayer and why Christians should not hesitate to pray it in any and all circumstances: "The best form of prayer is in the Lord's prayer, which Christ Himself has prescribed to us and has bidden us to pray. If you pray this prayer, you need not worry about having omitted anything. For Christ Himself can understand it better than you and can apply it better to all the particulars of present calamities than you, even though you made long explanations. Yet it is not bad – in fact, it is of great benefit – to pray expressly for this or that. Only let us strive for a heart that is sure that our prayer will not be offered in vain, but for Christ's sake. For if Christ has prescribed the form of prayer, it follows that it pleases Him...If He has promised to hear, it follows that He will hear. Therefore we should accustom ourselves to this Christian activity."

God's peace to you as you pray the Lord's Prayer. -Pastor Zucker

If you are interested in serving as a reader or have a question, please speak with Marcos Machado or Pastor Zucker.


Would you like a hymnal?

The Lutheran Service Book is the hymnal of our church. Individual hymnals cost \$30 each. We're asking people who are interested to sponsor one or more hymnals by giving money to cover the costs. For example, you might decide you'd like to buy two hymnals and give \$60 or you might give a fixed amount of \$10, \$50, or \$200 (or some other amount of your choosing) towards the purchase of hymnals.
