INTERPRET

1. How are people who are not focused on eternity with Jesus impacted by tribulation?
2. How should the promise of eternity with Jesus reframe our response to tribulation today?

ASSESS

1. What happened in your life in 2025 that could be categorized as tribulation? How did you respond to those tribulations?
2. What underlying beliefs and desires led to those responses?
3. How might you have responded differently to your trials if your deepest belief was that salvation and triumph were sealed by God, and your greatest desire was to find satisfaction in Jesus?
4. Other than Jesus, where do you tend to look for satisfaction?
5. What tools have you discovered to look to God for ultimate salvation and Jesus for ultimate satisfaction?
