Breathing Life Into Others

Main Theme: Spiritual CPR - Breathing life into others through encouragement, support, and love.

Introduction

- Importance of breathing life, akin to providing spiritual CPR.
- Acknowledgment of those who have offered support in our lives.

Scriptural Foundation

- **Jeremiah 17:7-8:** Trusted, planted, and rooted in God.
 - o Spiritual maturity involves being rooted in faith and community.
- Assessment of Atmosphere:
 - o Healthy vs. unhealthy environments (maturity).
 - o Reflect on personal impact—do you bring oxygen or deplete it?

The Choice of Impact

- Faith vs. Fear: Are you uplifting or suffocating those around you?
- Microscope vs. Telescope:
 - o Microscope: Over-scrutinize shortcomings.
 - o Telescope: Focus on potential and possibilities beyond current limitations

Biblical Examples of Breathing Life

- 1. Jonathan and His Armor Bearer (1 Samuel 14:6-7):
- o "Do all that you have in mind; I am with you heart and soul."
- 2. Galatians 6:2:
- o "Carry each other's burdens"—not to fix, but to support.
- 3. **Gideon's Encouragement** (Judges 6:12):
- o Recognizing the potential within others.
- 4. Barnabas, Son of Encouragement (Acts 4:36; 9:26-27):
- o Advocacy and opening doors for Saul.

Be a Refreshing/Restorative Person

Proverbs 11:25:

- o "A generous person will prosper; whoever refreshes others will be refreshed."
 - Metaphor of a pitcher of water:
 - o Encouraging, supporting, fostering positivity.
 - o When you pour into others, God refreshes you.

Encouragement in Community

- 1 Thessalonians 5:11:
 - o "Encourage one another and build each other up."

The Ministry of the Holy Spirit

- John 16:17:
 - o The Comforter will come to guide and support.
- Filling and encouraging:
 - o The Holy Spirit increases and restores rather than depletes.

Reflection

- After interactions, do people feel uplifted or diminished?
- Aim to lift one another up and actively support each other.

Conclusion: Communion and Community

- Acts 2:42, 44-47:
 - o Commitment to teaching, fellowship, and breaking bread together.
- Augustine of Hippo: "No one should be a Christian alone. The Church is a community of those who believe and gather to share the good news."

Call to Action:

 Find others to encourage and pray with, breathing life into those around us.
