God's Word

Today I begin with a question. In fact, some may say it is a harsh question, but here it goes:

"Jesus said to the Jews who had believed in him, 'If you continue in my word, you are truly my disciples; and you will know the truth, and the truth will make you free." John 8:31-32

When was the last time you picked up your Bible and read it?

- Actually picked up your Bible (hard copy or digital) and read God's Holy Word?
- Read more than one verse?
- Dug into its meaning and purpose?
- Engaged in conversation with other believers?
- Prayed for what God desires you would learn about God's Word?

Unfortunately, for many who call themselves God's children, the answer often goes something like this:



Bible study is for Sunday School children. The Bible is too complex, I don't understand it.

I was in church on Sunday. We read the Bible then.

I just don't have the time.

I meant to, but I forgot.

Reading, studying, and digesting God's Word is how we come to know God. As with any relationship, the more time we spend together, the more opportunities we have to know, understand, and love.

Being in God's Word is how we grow in relationship with God and come to understand what God expects from our relationships with others. Each of us is struggling: with identity, direction, goals, purpose... Everything we truly need, God's Word can provide. But if we don't make an effort to be in God's Word on a regular basis, how can we expect to experience the love, joy, hope, and freedom that the Bible talks about even in the midst of the struggles of this life?

As we prepare to celebrate the Reformation later this month, we will also

place God's Holy Word in the hands of Messiah's third graders! They will hold in their hands the word of God that leads to love, freedom, and eternal life!

May we join them and commit to being in God's Word, to growing in God's Word, to allowing God to reform our faith into something new and amazing.

If your Bible remains on the shelf, it will gather dust (and so will your faith).

Mission Endowment Fund

A **church mission endowment fund** is a dedicated pool of assets established to support the church's mission and programs over the long term. It is designed to provide ongoing financial support, ensuring the church's sustainability and ability to meet its needs in the present and future. Key features include:

- Long-term sustainability: The principal amount remains untouched, allowing for future withdrawals to support ongoing mission and ministry.
- **Income generation:** A portion of the endowment can be used each year to support the church's **MISSION**, while the remaining amount preserves the fund's value.
- **Investment strategy:** The funds are typically invested in a diversified portfolio to generate income and growth over time.
- **Flexibility:** Endowments can be modified to adapt to changing needs and goals, ensuring they remain relevant to the church's mission.
- Provides a way for donors to create a permanent and personal legacy to God's mission and ministry.

As Lutherans, we celebrate **Reformation Sunday** at the end of October to remember when Martin Luther posted his 95 theses on the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg, Germany, motivated by his passion to see the church reformed to reflect the message of God's saving grace.

It's also an opportunity to discern how God is at work re-forming each of us, including MLC. In the coming months, we'll be undertaking a process of **long range planning** – looking ahead to where God is calling us in the next 5-10 years. We will be forming a **Long Range Planning Committee** and will be soliciting your input through that committee. We are collecting blankets and cold weather clothing for the homeless in our area this fall and winter. Put new and lightly used items in the donation box in the Narthex. Here's what we need:




Adults: Sunday Morning Bible Study
