Council Update

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ.

St. Paul writes, "Now you are Christ's body, and individually members of it." (1 Cor. 12:27) This is likely a familiar passage to many where Paul explains how all members serve differently, but all are needed for the body to function...and all are needed to serve God's mission. As we begin September's service and stewardship emphasis, Council also wants to help enable you to thrive in your unique role in the body of Christ. Feel free to send questions or feedback to my email or to any Council member. Some updates from Council include:

- Faith Formation Leader: Based on a Synod recommendation, the Call Committee is working to broaden the job description for our rostered position. The current job responsibilities are very specific, so broadening the language may help us to attract more interest. A parallel "hybrid" option (hiring a non-rostered Faith Formation leader and part-time rostered leader to support congregational needs) is also under consideration.
- Fellowship Hall Refresh: The Fellowship Hall has a new coat of paint! Thank you to Stephanie, Caroline, Matthew, and Tim Kokan for all of their hard work on this project!

- Endowment Fund: Council approved a continuing resolution outlining the policy for Messiah's Mission Endowment Fund. Stay tuned for more details from the Endowment Committee on how this fund will be used and how you can participate.
- App Update: Our MLC app has 254 downloads! If you haven't downloaded the app yet, please do so. Not only is it a connection to our many ministries, worship live streams, and MLC resources, but it also provides us a communication tool in the event of an emergency.
- Fellowship Representative: We are still in need of a Fellowship Council Representative. Do you have ideas for fellowship opportunities? Would you like to help coordinate volunteers to make those ideas happen? If so, please reach out to any Council member.

Outreach Spotlight: Kit & Comforters Ministries

While our Kit and Comforters Ministries do enjoy their time together, they don't just make beautiful quilts, shop for supplies, and chat. These groups partner with Lutheran World Relief (LWR) to provide life-changing support for people around the world.

Last year alone, our congregation sent more than 5,000 pounds of aid — including Baby Care Kits, Personal Care Kits, and School Kits — offering comfort and hope to families in crisis.

This year, we've already prepared **4,709 pounds of kits**, and we're not done counting!



So far, we have counted **120 quilts and 1,832 kits** that will go to those in the most need.

What Goes Into the Kits

Kits are lovingly packed here at Messiah and then shipped to LWR's warehouse in Maryland. From there, they travel wherever the need is greatest. Visit the LWR website to see where relief has traveled around the world.

We focus on three types of kits:

- Baby Care Kits cloth diapers, blankets, soap, and clothes to give little ones a strong start
- Personal Care Kits towels, soap, and hygiene essentials to support health and dignity
- School Kits supplies tucked into hand-sewn backpacks to keep kids learning, even in times of crisis

Quilts

Quilts can be used as warm bedding, simple tents, or floor coverings. Each one reflects God's loving presence in a world rife with suffering.

How You Can Get Involved

These ministries are only possible because of so many willing hands and hearts. Whether you love to sew, assemble, or organize — there's a place for you! We even have ways to participate off-site, like shopping and work-from-home tasks.

- Join Kit Ministry on Thursdays at 6:30 p.m. in the Fellowship Hall (no meetings in September or December).
- Participate in special kit-assembly events throughout the year.
- Join Comforters on Tuesdays at 9 a.m. to make quilts, lap robes, and prayer shawls for both global and local distribution. You can even learn from the group!



Every stitch, every kit, every contribution is a way to share God's love in a hurting world.
