SERVING = Seeing + Feeling + Doing

Mark 6:30-34

³⁰ The apostles returned to Jesus from their ministry tour
and told him all they had done and taught. ³¹ Then Jesus said, *"Let's go off by ourselves to a quiet place and rest awhile."*He said this because there were so many people coming and going
that Jesus and his apostles didn't even have time to eat. ³² So
they left by boat for a quiet place, where they could be alone.

Sometimes the most spiritual thing you can do is <u>REST</u>.

³³ But many people recognized them and saw them leaving, and people from many towns ran ahead along the shore and got there ahead of them. ³⁴ Jesus <u>saw</u> the huge crowd as he stepped off the boat, and he was <u>moved with compassion</u> toward them because they were like sheep without a shepherd. So he began <u>teaching</u> them many things. (+ healing and feeding)

Seeing.

- See the <u>person</u> behind the <u>problem</u>.
- See the problem as an opportunity.

Love doesn't IGNORE.

Q: Who are you overlooking or ignoring?

Feeling.

- <u>Sorry</u> is what you feel from a distance, <u>compassion</u> is what you feel up close.
- God will never use you greatly until he breaks you deeply.
- Serving without feeling, leads to <u>quitting</u> or <u>resenting</u>.
- Q: How's your heart? Is it apathetic or judgmental?

You'll never DO what Jesus did until you FEEL what Jesus felt.

Doing.

- Do what you <u>can</u> right where you <u>are</u>.
- Do what you <u>can</u> and release what you <u>can't</u>.
- Q: What can you do to help?

Compassion is LOVE in ACTION.

Sending.

Matthew 9:36-38

³⁶ When <u>he saw</u> the crowds, <u>he was moved with compassion</u> because they were confused and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. ³⁷ He said to his disciples, "*The harvest is great, but the workers are few.* ³⁸ So pray to the Lord who is in charge of the harvest; ask him to <u>send more workers</u> into his fields."

TRUTH: <u>We</u> are the workers they were praying for.
