INTRODUCTION

When life presents you with the deep end, find a way to float.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. How have you experienced feeling *"stuck"* in your own life, and how does the Israelites' situation in Egypt resonate with that feeling?
2. The sermon mentions *"One of Satan's Greatest Lies: The pain of familiar dysfunction is better than the anxiety of challenging progress."* How have you seen this play out in your own life or in the lives of others?
3. Reflect on the Israelites' journey from slavery to freedom. What parallels can you draw between their experience and the challenges we face today?
4. How does fear impact our decision-making when we're in difficult situations? Share examples from your own life.
5. The sermon emphasizes two main instructions: *"Don't surrender"* and *"Don't panic."* Which of these do you struggle with more, and why?
6. Discuss the statement: *"Every 'right step' gets you closer to your destiny."* How can this perspective change the way we approach challenges?
7. How does remembering that *"God is fighting for you"* affect your approach to seemingly insurmountable obstacles?
8. What was your biggest takeaway from the message, and why?
