Sunrise by Susan May Warren is the first novel in the Sky King Ranch series which focuses on two main characters, Echo and Dodge. The tale is set in the rugged, beautiful, and dangerous Alaskan wilderness where life is precarious, and the scenery is majestic. While never having been to Alaska, it was easy to get a picture in my mind with the way Susan describes the wilderness in such detail. Dodge is a veteran who for a reason not immediately apparent left Alaska only to reluctantly return when his father's plane crashed shortly before landing. Dodge's father has flown his route many times, and the family business of flying cargo may be on the line due to the recent mishap. Dodge and his father have a tenuous relationship that is heightened when Dodge is needed to take over his father's routes. There is something in the past that has hindered Dodge and his father from growing closer. Audiences will read what happened and see if there is any hope for them. Echo and Dodge have grown up together and at one point Dodge wanted to marry her. Now, as adults, there is still some of the pain from the past that keeps Echo from moving forward in her life. Echo has many talents and is a very loving caretaker of her dogs. She lives with her father who oversees the tracking of two bears released back into the wild. When Dodge returns, Echo isn't sure if they are even friends let alone if they can capture the love they once shared. But there is another pain in the past that colors her outlook of the present and future. She is a character who is solid, and readers get to see how she faces the challenges of life and soul in the story. (Review from Amazon)

<u>The Lady's Mine</u> by Francine Rivers 1875. When Kathryn Walsh arrives in tiny Calvada, a mining town nestled in the Sierra Nevadas, falling in love is the farthest thing from her mind. Banished from Boston by her wealthy stepfather, she has come to claim an inheritance from the uncle she never knew: a defunct newspaper office on a main street overflowing with brothels and saloons, and a seemingly worthless mine. Moved by the oppression of the local miners and their families, Kathryn decides to relaunch her uncle's newspaper—and then finds herself in the middle of a maelstrom, pitted against Calvada's most powerful men. But Kathryn intends to continue to say—and publish—whatever she pleases, especially when she knows she's right. Matthias Beck, owner of a local saloon and hotel, has a special interest in the new lady in town. He instantly recognizes C. T. Walsh's same tenacity in the beautiful and outspoken redhead—and knows all too well how dangerous that family trait can be. While Kathryn may be right about Calvada's problems, her righteousness could also get her killed. But when the handsome hotelier keeps finding himself on the same side of the issues as the opinionated Miss Walsh, Matthias's restless search for purpose becomes all about answering the call of his heart. <u>To Steal a Heart</u> by Jen Turano is the beginning of a new series involving the women of a boarding house on Bleecker Street in New York. One of the residents, Gabriella, meets Nicholas, a close childhood friend she hasn't seen in years, in most peculiar circumstances at a society costume ball. They all get into quite a few adventures, especially after the ladies decide to start an inquiry agency to help women. I really enjoyed the wide diversity of characters, including Winston the one-eyed eyepatch wearing dog. If you are looking for suspense, mystery, humor, and a good fun read, this is the book for you.
