Michelle Shocklee, author of the award-winning historical novels <u>Under the Tulip Tree</u> and <u>Count the Nights by Stars</u>, has another excellent new release titled <u>Appalachian Song</u>. This book takes us deep into the Appalachian Mountains and explores the family of Bertie Jenkins and her sisters. Bertie is a midwife and still recalls the day Songbird showed up on her doorstep pregnant and injured – and soon forced to make a heartbreaking decision. Thirty years later, a famous country singer and an adoption advocate arrive in Tennessee, hoping to discover the reason he was relinquished by his birth mom. Will Bertie reveal any secrets? Are they hers to tell?

<u>Into the Fire</u> by Irene Hannon is the first novel of her Undaunted Courage Series.

Arson Investigator, Bri Tucker, is left with several fiery deaths to solve after her colleague dies in a mysterious blaze. As Bri struggles to figure out with whom she can safely share the evidence and questions that keep her awake at night, she teams up with ATF Special Agent, Marc Davis. Although he is intrigued by Bri's findings, his hands are somewhat tied due to his position. They both have excellent instincts, but someone lurking in the darkness seems to know more than the investigators realize. Will they to be able to solve this dangerous puzzle before it is too late? I enjoyed reading this fast-paced suspense novel. It kept me guessing. Review by Norene Sattler

Flying Blind by Dave Jackson is an edge of your seat novel. The story begins in remote south-central Columbia at Finca Fe, a boarding school for missionary kids, expats and various local children situated along the Magdalena River. The school is attacked by the Revolutionary Armed Forces of Columbia. Three are kidnapped, including nurse Terri Kaplan. Nick Archer was a bush pilot for the Missionary Aviation Support Team when the Revolutionary's attacked. Nick and his plane were stationed there, but he escaped capture and injury. Driven by his love for Terri, Nick ignores his diabetes and its threat to his eyesight while he risks everything to find Terri and rescue her from the jungle camp where the FARC has taken her to attend to their wounded. Duplicity by the CIA and pressure from the United States on the Colombian government to curtail the rampant cocaine trade turn Nick's rescue efforts into a total disaster. Complicating their crises are spiritual battles: Terri becomes confused about what she should do when she actually has a chance to escape, and Nick wonders where God is or if He even exists when God does not seem to answer any of his prayers. When Nick loses his vision from neglecting his eye problems at the very moment he has a chance to save Terri, he ends up flying blind! How can a blind pilot rescue a kidnapped nurse from desperate guerillas?
