# Women's Quilting Group



What do the Coopersville area families Aarnink, Beernink, Bennink, Bosink, Busman, Gaalken, Gunneman, Handlogten, Harmsen, Laug, Lubben, Rankans, Smoes and Stroven have in common? The answer is that they all trace their roots to the Reformed Church at Nordhorn, Germany.

When the Dutch came to Western Michigan in 1847, along with them came a number of immigrants from just across the border in Germany. This small area, known as Grafschaft Bentheim, was once an independent principality, much like Lichtenstein. In 1588, the Count of Bentheim accepted the Reformed confessions and his subjects followed suit. They had much in common with their neighbors in the Netherlands. Linguistically, the borders meant little. The people on both sides of the border spoke very similar dialects. The county itself consists of only 379 square miles, and was very rural in the 1800s, yet thousands of people left it for a new life, either in The Netherlands or in America.


The original immigrants settled just south of Holland, Michigan where the villages of Graafschap and Bentheim, are named for their old homeland.

Several Rankans (originally Rammelkamp) siblings came to the Coopersville area about 1855 from an area near Nordhorn in Bentheim. They settled southeast of Coopersville, where a school, the Rankins school was named for them. They came from Bakelde, a hamlet in the parish of Nordhorn. You can read about one of the brothers in the photo essay, entitled "Frederick Rankans, a life cut short." It wasn't until after the Civil War ended that more immigrants from Bentheim arrived. This included the families Laug, Lubben, and Busman who purchased land together very close to Coopersville. This group had settled originally in Piqua, Ohio.

In 1882, at the age of 48, Harm Rankans of Coopersville returned to Bentheim and escorted a number of families from Nordhorn to Michigan. He traveled under his birth name of Rammelkamp. By 1883, there were so many families from Nordhorn in the area that they constituted five of the eight members of the Coopersville Reformed Church Council.

Another family that maintained ties with Nordhorn was the Busmans. In 1952, when Jake Busman was stationed in Germany while serving in the army, he visited the old family farm near Nordhorn and was allowed to play the organ at the Reformed Church in Nordhorn. His visit was featured in the Coopersville Observer at the time.

Bentheim is referenced on two cemetery stones in Maplewood Cemetery in Lamont. On the left, Geeze Rankans is said to have been born in Bakeld, Graafschap Bentheim, Hanover. On the other, Janna Bennink is reported to have been born in Graafschap Bentheim, Germany. Bentheim, once part of the Kingdom of Hanover, later became incorporated into modern Germany. Like Geeze, Janna was also born in Bakeld(e) which is a hamlet in the parish of Nordhorn.
