<u>Sisters By the Sea</u> is a collection of four stories each featuring one of the resilient Lambright sisters, Leora, Violet, Francine and Alana. Set in the village of Pinecraft in southwest Florida, each sister has their own reason for moving to Florida from their more familiar and traditional Amish communities in Indiana. This book was written by Wanda Brunstetter, Jean Brunstetter, Richelle Brunstetter and Loring Brunstetter Van Corbach, with each one writing about one of the Lambright sisters.

Facing the Enemy by Diann Mills is a super suspenseful novel and difficult to put down once you start reading. When the long-awaited reunion between Risa and her brother, Trenton, ends in tragedy, Risa is riddled with guilt, unable to cope with the responsibility she feels over his death. On leave from the FBI, Risa returns to her former career as an English teacher at a local college, only to see her past and present collide when one of her students, Carson Mercury, turns in an assignment that reads like an eyewitness account of her brother's murder, with details never revealed publicly. Alarmed by Carson's inside knowledge of Trenton's death, Risa reaches out to her former partner at the FBI. Special Agent Gage Patterson has been working on a string of baby kidnappings, but he agrees to help look into Carson's background. Risa and Gage soon discover their cases might be connected as a string of high-value thefts have occurred at properties where security systems were installed by Carson's stepfather and children have gone missing. There's a far more sinister plot at play than they ever imagined and innocent lives are in danger.

<u>Trace of Doubt</u> by DiAnn Mills will keep you guessing and read this one with the lights on! Did Shelby Pearce go to prison for a crime she didn't commit? Does she know the whereabouts of the \$500,000 that is missing from her brother-in-law's account? Is FBI agent Denton McClure a friend or foe? Fifteen years ago, Shelby Pearce confessed to murdering her brother-in-law and was sent to prison. Now she's out on parole and looking for a fresh start in the small town of Valleysburg, Texas. But starting over won't be easy for an ex-con. FBI Special Agent Denton McClure was a rookie fresh out of Quantico when he was first assigned the Pearce case. He's always believed Shelby embezzled five hundred thousand dollars from her brother-in-law's account. So, he's going undercover to befriend Shelby, track down the missing money, and finally crack this case. But as Denton gets closer to Shelby, he begins to have a trace of doubt about her guilt. Someone has Shelby in their crosshairs. It's up to Denton to stop them before they silence Shelby—and the truth—forever. You will encounter some surprising twists as you try to figure everything out in this suspenseful novel. Diann Mills is an edge of your seat writer. Her stories have a good message of how God works in all situations, but these books aren't for those who are bothered by high suspense.
