<u>Things We Didn't Say</u> is by Amy Lynn Green. This novel takes place in the winter of 1944 in the little town of Ironside Lake, Minnesota. The author states that this novel is fictional but is based heavily on the real experiences of POW camps in the Midwest. Johanna Berglund has reluctantly returned to her hometown as a translator for a camp of German POWs during WWII. The people of Ironside Lake are distrustful of the POWs. They are also suspicious of Johanna as she begins to interact with the prisoners. Will motives be questioned? Will truth be twisted? Will Johanna be charged with treason? Review by Norene Sattler.

<u>The Escape</u> by Lisa Harris is the first book in the new U.S. Marshals series. US Marshals Madison James and Jonas Quinn are thrust into a high-profile case when they are called on to transport two prisoners across the country on a private plane. But when the plane experiences engine trouble in route from the Pacific Northwest to Colorado, the pilots crash-land the aircraft deep in the heart of the sprawling Salmon -Challis National Forest.

When Madison and Jonas regain consciousness, they find both pilots and one prisoner dead--and one fugitive on the run. They'll have to negotiate the rugged and remote backcountry through Idaho, Wyoming, and Colorado while tracking a murderer who is desperate to disappear--and will do anything to stop them.

This high-octane game of cat-and-mouse from bestselling and award-winning author Lisa Harris will have your heart pumping as you try to catch a fugitive with nothing to lose. (Publisher description)

<u>The Solid Grounds Coffee Company</u> by Carla Laureano. "For the first time in a long time, she was actually looking at herself." But it's best to start at the beginning, when Analyn Sanchez carefully hid herself behind a successful career of disguising high-powered clients who needed to spin away their mistakes and indiscretions. However, when she refuses to compromise moral and legal boundaries, Ana is granted a generous paid leave from her high salaried position in one of Denver's most prestigious publicity firms. She now has time on her hands, a plethora of marketing skills and a friend with a start-up fair trade coffee roasting company. . . is it a coincidence or divine intervention?

Bryan Shaw's life has undergone a gargantuan metamorphosis following a climbing accident and subsequent loss of a professional climbing career. After a gut level change of priorities and impulsive investment into a Columbian coffee farm, he's back in Denver to re-connect and plunge into the roasting business. But he needs help, and Ana seems interested enough to help him. However, it's soon evident to both of them that there is another kind of "slow roasting" going on between the surface. More than likely, it could never work, but what if it could?

"The Solid Grounds Coffee Company" beautifully illustrates what it's like to stand on the promises of God. . . making all things new, doing exceedingly above what we ask or think, old things passing away, nothing being impossible with God . . . life is usually messy, when it's real; poised on the brink of free falling is usually where we find "solid ground". Readers will discover pieces of themselves through-out this lovely story . . . while they are enviously imagining all those coffee tastings! (Review from Christian Book website).
