1 Thessalonians 5:16-18

Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus.

Psalm 103:1-4

Praise the LORD, my soul; all my inmost being, praise His holy name. Praise the LORD, my soul, and forget not all His benefits — who forgives all your sins and heals all your diseases, who redeems your life from the pit and crowns you with love and compassion.

Colossians 2:6-7 (NKJV)

As you therefore have received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk in Him, rooted and built up in Him and established in the faith, as you have been taught, abounding in it with thanksgiving.

Isaiah 12:4-5 (NASB)

And on that day you will say, "Give thanks to the LORD, call on His name. Make known His deeds among the peoples; make them remember that His name is exalted." Praise the LORD in song, for He has done glorious things; let this be known throughout the earth.

School Supplies: Pencils, colored pencils, crayons, markers, pens, coloring books, picture books, notebooks, watercolor paints, stickers, etc.

<u>Under the Magnolias</u> by T.I. Lowe is a fictional tale set in Magnolia, South Carolina in 1980. You will discover the stunning portrayal of love overcoming all odds, with her congregation of nonconformists gathered together by an over-the-top preacher who might well be nicknamed "First Riffraff of Magnolia." You will discover the transforming effects of forgiveness and acceptance. When two lives slowly unravel, it takes a village or in this case, a church to provide healing and wholeness. <u>Provenance</u> by Carla Laureano (fiction) Just as Kendall is about to lose her home and business in L.A., her grandmother leaves her several historic properties in Colorado. Mayor Brandt has been lamenting Jasper Lake's slow demise, so he is overjoyed to welcome Kendall-an expert in provenance, and he is hoping she will restore the town to its former splendor. But after meeting Kendall, he realizes there are things Kendall must learn, to embrace this new future ahead of her.

<u>Crossed Lines</u> by Jennifer Delamere is the second book in the Love Along the Wires series. Witty wordsmith Mitchell believes he does not have a chance with Emma, who works two floors above him in London's Central Telegraph Office. When his tongue-tied co-worker, who once saved Mitchell's life begs for him to help write Emma love letters...Mitchell reluctantly agrees. Will Emma be wooed by these letters? Will she discover who is writing them? If you enjoyed book one of this series titled Line by Line, you will most certainly enjoy this one as well.

Chasing Shadows by Lynn Austin If you were inspired by the life of Corrie tenBoom as told in The Hiding Place, you definitely will want to read Chasing Shadows, the intriguing story of faith during a dark time in history. The lives of three women change instantly when the Nazis invade the neutral Netherlands. In different seasons of life and with different outlooks on the world, the paths of these three women will cross in unexpected and heartbreaking ways as they face the challenges of living during WWII. Lena must rely on steadfast faith when her quiet life farming alongside her husband becomes full of fear for the safety of her family and the shadow people (Jews) they are helping. Ans, Lena's daughter, is drawn to move to the city and begins dangerous Resistance Work to fight the enemy, embarking on her own faith journey. Miriam is a Jewish violinist who immigrated to Holland for safety, whose faith is tested with seemingly impossible choices in hopes that her family will survive. These women face incredible challenges daily as they try to survive amidst the horrors of war. Yet despite fear and heartbreak they endure and the power of faith and love carries them through. A very unique story about courage during adversity and how faith sustained them during life and death situations. Many of the incidents in this story are based on true accounts of courageous Dutch Christians who lived through the Nazi occupation. Review by Lynda Johnson
