Benefít








Are you ready to travel to Rock Harbor? Colleen Coble's latest installment in the Rock Harbor series takes us there in a story titled <u>Break of Day</u>. Law enforcement officer Annie Pederson's life has been rocked by tragedy, but things finally seem to be heading in the right direction. She is even building back trust with her sister, Sarah, after a separation that lasted for decades. However, when a man escapes law enforcement custody and Sarah's safety is suddenly in question, Annie's personal and professional lives once again merge. Meanwhile, her investigation of hikers who have gone missing in the remote woods of Michigan's Upper Peninsula puts her in the crosshairs of a deadly game. Now Annie is the one being hunted!

<u>Ladies of the Lake</u> by Cathy Gohlke is a wonderful historical Christian fiction story that revolves around the friendship of four women around the time of the Halifax Explosion that occurred on December 6, 1917 and before the dawn of WWI. "Ladies of the Lake," as the four girls call themselves bond like sisters at an all-girls school and vow that wherever life takes them, they will always be there for each other. Many things happen in their lives and things are not always what they seem. This story really comes alive as the characters develop and share joys and sorrows, wars and tragedy, betrayal, love, and forgiveness. I really like how the history was woven throughout the story. It took a few chapters to get into but once I did, it was difficult to put down and a twist right at the end was a surprise.

<u>The Swindler's Daughter</u> by Stephenia H. McGee is a novel with a bit of everything: an underlying mystery, action, historical times and places, and an unexpected romance. Lillian has lived her high society life with her widowed mother believing her father died long ago. She is startled to find out that her estranged father only recently passed away and that he has left a business and all his possessions to her, making her an heiress of her father's dilapidated house in the backwoods of Georgia. She soon discovers she has family she never knew about and a family business that is more than meets the eye and puts a target on her back. Well written with twists and turns of mystery woven through the story, it is a great read.
