

Making Room for Wonder

As we step into December, I'm reminded how quickly this season can fill up with noise — lists, plans, gatherings, expectations, and the pressure to "make the holidays magical" even when our lives feel anything but magical. Some of us enter December with joy. Others limp into it with exhaustion. Many of us arrive carrying a mix of both.

And here's the good news:

God meets us in all of it.

Advent is the season of holy interruption — a time when God slips quietly into our busy, aching, ordinary lives and says, "I am here."

This year, more than ever, I've felt how desperately we all need that presence. We need the reminder that God comes not to the already-prepared, the already-perfect, or the already-peaceful — but to real people with real fears, real schedules, and real hearts. He comes quietly, slipping into the cracks where our strength runs out and brings hope, joy, peace and love.

When Mary said "yes" to God, it wasn't because her life was tidy.

It was because she made a little room — a corner of her heart — for wonder. That's our invitation this Advent.

Not to do more. Not to decorate more. Not to accomplish more. But to make room.

Room for stillness. Room for hope. Room for the unexpected ways God is moving.

Room for kindness — both given *and* received.

Room for the Christ who comes to us in vulnerability and grace.

And friends, no matter **how** you show up this Advent and Christmas — whether you come hopeful or weary, overwhelmed or grateful, steady or stumbling, full of faith or barely holding on —

Presidents Message

In council we have be discussing asset-based ministry, how can we do God's work best with the Assets we have. Those assets might be a building with a large hall and a kitchen that can be used to feed the hungry, a parking lot with a basketball hoop that allows us to engage with our neighbors, appropriate investment strategies for the money given to the church.

Each of us brings various assets or gifts to church. Sometimes we call these the three T's - time talents and treasures. During December we will be asking about your unique talents and also your needs. Just as a teacher needs students to fulfill their teaching talent, the church can match our skills with the various needs of the congregation and the staff. The two questions that will be included in the bulletin insert are:

1. What is something you need, would like to have, or to learn?

This can include items like help with snow removal, buying groceries, prayer, a visit with Pastor, to learn more about being a Lutheran, to be confirmed (many of us who joined the Lutheran church later in life never went through confirmation), etc.

2. Question 2. What is something you can give, do or teach?

This can include things like help with snow removal, learn camera or other tech team skills, help with Altar Guild, make chili for the chili cook off in 2026, give more to the church (time, talents, treasure), teach a class for members and guests, etc.
