The liturgical color is green for the spiritual growth the Holy Spirit works in our hearts through the Word.

After his resurrection, Jesus promised that when Christians forgive each others' sins, their words are as valid and certain as his. (John 20:22-23)

Having received the gift of the Lord's forgiveness, we now make our requests on the basis of his mercy.

Throughout the service, titles like "Kyrie" refer to the historic names for the ancient texts of the Church's lituray.

Jesus said that the angels in heaven rejoice over one sinner who repents. In response to the repentance expressed through confession and absolution, the church sings as the angels sang on Christmas night: "Glory be to God on high."



By standing and singing "Alleluia" (Praise the Lord) as we prepare to hear the gospel, Christ's people express their trust in his promise to be present among them through his word.

²²"The time came when the beggar died and the angels carried him to Abraham's side. Father in heaven, you sent your Son who, for our sake, became poor with our debt of sin so that we by his poverty might be rich in holiness and grace. As you have so enriched us, enlighten our eyes to see those in poverty around us, and grant that our faith might be evident in love toward those in need. Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

O Lord, as you once gave Moses and the prophets so that people might hear your Word, continue to provide messengers to make your gospel known among the nations. Preserve those who currently serve within your Church, and raise up more workers to labor in the harvest. Lord, in your mercy,

hear our prayer.

Heavenly Father, we praise your name for your faithfulness to Abraham and to all the saints who have gone before us. Enliven us by your Word and Sacraments, that, convinced of Jesus' death and resurrection, we may eagerly await the day of our resurrection for his sake; through Jesus Christ, your Son, our Lord.


Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

Therefore, with all the saints on earth and hosts of heaven, we praise your holy name and join their glorious song:

In the presence of the Triune God, angels sing, "Holy, holy is the Lord God Almighty." (Isaiah 6:4). The Church sings the same song in preparation for Holy Communion, firmly confessing the Lord's presence in the Sacrament.



Prayer of Thanksgiving

Blessed are you, Lord God, eternal King and gracious Father. In love you made us the crown of your creation. In mercy you planned our salvation. In grace you sent your Son to redeem us from sin.

We remember and give you thanks that your eternal Son, Jesus Christ, became flesh and made his dwelling among us, that he willingly placed himself under law to redeem those under law, that he humbled himself by becoming obedient to death on a cross, that he has destroyed death and has brought life and immortality to light through the gospel.

Bless us as we receive your Son's body and blood in this Sacrament. 
