Time of Year: Sundays after Pentecost

The Festival of Pentecost marks the transition from the first half of the Christian Church Year to the second. During this Sundays after Pentecost, our attention shifts from the life of Christ to the teachings of Christ. Jesus' words establish our faith, transform our hearts and minds, and guide our lives in him. The liturgical color is green for the spiritual growth the Holy Spirit works in our hearts through the Word.



Current Series: Faith Full

Strong faith is a blessing. It provides a shield against the devil's attacks and a shelter in the midst of life's storms. It's no wonder God wants our hearts to be full of faith. But faith isn't something we can fill our own hearts with. Instead, the fuel that keeps our hearts full of faith flows freely and abundantly from God.

Service Focus

By nature, however, we are helplessly prone to put our faith in our own merits and worth. As a result, God uses his law to eliminate the natural pride from our hearts. Once we despair of ourselves, we have nowhere to turn but the saving grace of God in Jesus.

Lord, have mercy.


For this holy house and for all who offer here their worship and praise, let us pray to the Lord.

Throughout the service, titles like "Kyrie" refer to the historic names for the ancient texts of the Church's liturgy.

Jesus said that the angels in heaven rejoice over one sinner who repents. In response to the repentance expressed through confession and absolution, the church sings as the angels sang on Christmas night: "Glory be to God on high."






The Word

Deuteronomy 10:12-22

¹²And now, Israel, what does the LORD your God ask of you but to fear the LORD your God, to walk in obedience to him, to love him, to serve the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul, ¹³and to observe the LORD's commands and decrees that I am giving you today for your own good?

¹⁴To the LORD your God belong the heavens, even the highest heavens, the earth and everything in it. ¹⁵Yet the LORD set his affection on your ancestors and loved them, and he chose you, their descendants, above all the nations—as it is today. ¹⁶Circumcise your hearts, therefore, and do not be stiff-necked any longer. ¹⁷For the LORD your God is God of gods and Lord of lords, the great God, mighty and awesome, who shows no partiality and accepts no bribes. ¹⁸He defends the cause of the fatherless and the widow, and loves the foreigner residing among you, giving them food and clothing. ¹⁹And you are to love those who are foreigners, for you yourselves were foreigners in Egypt. ²⁰Fear the LORD your God and serve him. Hold fast to him and take your oaths in his name. ²¹He is the one you praise; he is your God, who performed for you those great and awesome wonders you saw with your own eyes. ²²Your ancestors who went down into Egypt were seventy in all, and now the LORD your God has made you as numerous as the stars in the sky.


