#### Time of Year: Christmas

The celebration of Jesus' birth on December 25 has been widely practiced by the church in the West since at least the fourth century. What the Church spent the four weeks of Advent preparing for, it now celebrates during the Twelve Days of Christmas. This twelve-day observance concludes with the Epiphany of Our Lord on January 6.

### **Service Focus**

On Christmas Eve we focus on the specific manner in which God chose to get close to humanity in his Son Jesus. Though God's Son could have come to earth in full majesty and power, he came instead as a tiny, helpless child. His lowly beginning in Bethlehem's manger was a sign of the lowliness and humility that would mark his life from beginning to end. He came not to conquer or condemn. He was born a child because he was born to save.

Jesus Christ, be our light and scatter the darkness, and shine within your people here.

<sup>\*</sup> A vigil is a period of staying awake during the time normally spent asleep, especially for the purpose of keeping watch. In the Church, a vigil refers to a service held on the eve before one of the major festivals of the year. This practice has been around for centuries and used to include many festivals throughout the year. In our day, evening services before Christmas Day and Easter are the most common vigils still observed.



Gospel Luke 2:1–20

A Savior has been born; peace on earth and glory to God in the highest.

¹In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world. ²(This was the first census that took place while Quirinius was governor of Syria.) ³And everyone went to their own town to register.

<sup>4</sup>So Joseph also went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to Bethlehem the town of David, because he belonged to the house and line of David. <sup>5</sup>He went there to register with Mary, who was pledged to be married to him and was expecting a child. <sup>6</sup>While they were there, the time came for the baby to be born, <sup>7</sup>and she gave birth to her firstborn, a son. She wrapped him in cloths and placed him in a manger, because there was no guest room available for them.

<sup>8</sup>And there were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks at night. <sup>9</sup>An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. <sup>10</sup>But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. <sup>15</sup>When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let's go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has told us about."

<sup>16</sup>So they hurried off and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby, who was lying in the manger. <sup>17</sup>When they had seen him, they spread the word concerning what had been told them about this child, <sup>18</sup>and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds said to them. <sup>19</sup>But Mary treasured up all these things and pondered them in her heart. <sup>20</sup>The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all the things they had heard and seen, which were just as they had been told.




