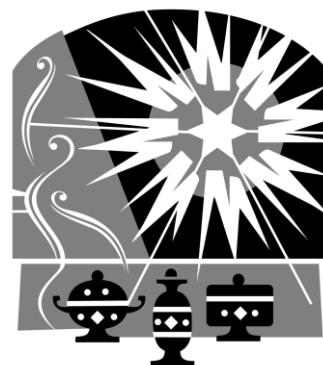

Time of Year: Christmas

The celebration of Jesus' birth on December 25 has been widely practiced by the church in the West since at least the fourth century. What the Church spent the four weeks of Advent preparing for, it now celebrates during the Twelve Days of Christmas. This twelve-day observance concludes with the Epiphany of Our Lord on January 6.



Christmas Series: Getting Close

Once Christmas has arrived, there's always a bit of a let down. Once the big day has come and gone, you might wonder if anything is different or if all the effort was worth it. While that might be the case with the day we call Christmas, it's by no means the case with the event we celebrate at Christmas. Because of Jesus' birth, this one day on the calendar means God is with us forever.

Service Focus

The church's twelve-day celebration of Christmas concludes with the Epiphany of Our Lord (January 6). On Epiphany, we see how God did not get close just to one group or nation at Christmas. Instead, Jesus came to be a light for the whole world. This truth was prophesied centuries before Jesus' birth and made evident already in the journey of the Magi to Jesus. Not only did God send us his Son at Christmas, but he moves heaven and earth to draw all people close to his Son.

Dialogue for Epiphany

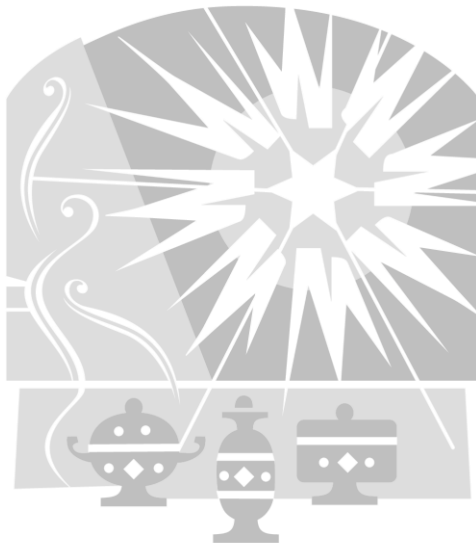
The Lord is my light and my salvation—whom shall I fear?

²Surely you have heard about the administration of God's grace that was given to me for you, ³that is, the mystery made known to me by revelation, as I have already written briefly. ⁴In reading this, then, you will be able to understand my insight into the mystery of Christ, ⁵which was not made known to people in other generations as it has now been revealed by the Spirit to God's holy apostles and prophets. ⁶This mystery is that through the gospel the Gentiles are heirs together with Israel, members together of one body, and sharers together in the promise in Christ Jesus.

⁷I became a servant of this gospel by the gift of God's grace given me through the working of his power. ⁸Although I am less than the least of all the Lord's people, this grace was given me: to preach to the Gentiles the boundless riches of Christ, ⁹and to make plain to everyone the administration of this mystery, which for ages past was kept hidden in God, who created all things. ¹⁰His intent was that now, through the church, the manifold wisdom of God should be made known to the rulers and authorities in the heavenly realms, ¹¹according to his eternal purpose that he accomplished in Christ Jesus our Lord. ¹²In him and through faith in him we may approach God with freedom and confidence.

⁶“But you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah,
are by no means least among the rulers of Judah;

for out of you will come a ruler
who will shepherd my people Israel.”

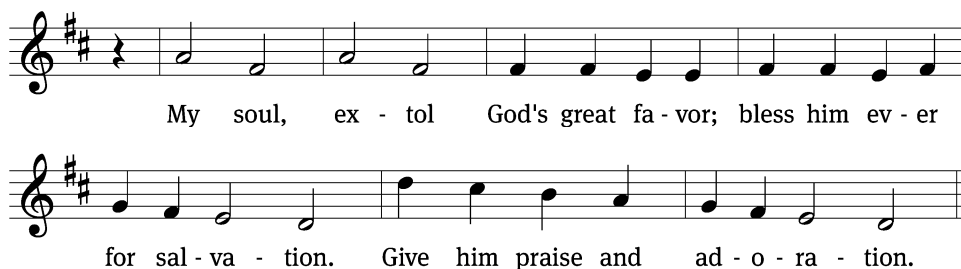



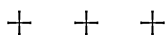
