In Psalm 121:5-8, we're assured, "The LORD watches over you—the LORD is your shade at your right hand; the sun will not harm you by day, nor the moon by night. The LORD will keep you from all harm—he will watch over your life; the LORD will watch over your coming and going both now and forevermore." Just as we seek shade from the scorching sun, we can find rest in God's presence. He is our refuge. Right before these verses the Psalmist asks where our help comes from? It comes from the Lord, offering cool comfort when the pressures of life threaten to overwhelm us. 




A Warm Summer Day
