#### Eight Is Enough: Eight Words Jesus Wants Us to Know

"Jesus spoke many words, but eight stand out as pillars of our faith... words to know, live, and be transformed by."



There are so many words in the English language that have meaning. In the coming weeks we will be talking about the eight words that Jesus emphasizes as words we should know.

In our walk with Christ, certain words stand out as pillars of our faith—words that Jesus not only taught but also lived out in His ministry. These words guide us, challenge us, and draw us closer to God. Let's explore eight powerful words—truth, obey, repent, forgive, grace, faith, hope, and love—that Jesus wants us to know and embody.

The first word is *truth*. In John 14:6 Jesus declared, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." Truth is the foundation of His teachings, revealing God's character and will. To know truth is...

to know Jesus. Jesus calls us to live authentically, free from deception. As we embrace His truth, we find clarity in a world often clouded by confusion. Let's seek truth daily through Scripture and prayer, aligning our hearts with His.

The second word is *obey*. In John 14:15 Jesus says, "If you love me, keep my commands." Obedience to Jesus is not about rigid rule-following but a heartfelt response to His love. It's choosing His way over ours, trusting that His commands lead to life. Obedience can be challenging, but it's an act of worship that strengthens our relationship with Him. Where is Jesus calling us to obey today?

The third word is *repent*. Jesus began His ministry with a clear call in Matthew 4:17, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near." Repentance is turning away from sin and toward God. Repentance is acknowledging our need for His forgiveness. It's not a one-time act but a daily reorienting of our hearts.

Through repentance, we experience the freedom of a renewed life in Christ. Let's embrace repentance as a gift that restores us.

The fourth word is *forgive*. In Matthew 6:14 Jesus says "For if you forgive other people when they sin against you, your heavenly Father will also forgive you."

Jesus modeled forgiveness even on the cross, offering it to those who wronged Him. Forgiving others releases us from bitterness and reflects God's mercy. It's not always easy, but through Christ's strength, we can forgive as He does.

The fifth word is grace. In Ephesians 2:8 we learn this from Paul, "For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith." Grace is

God's love in action, covering our shortcomings and empowering us to live for Him. It's a gift we don't earn but are called to share.

The sixth word is *faith*. In Mark 9:23 Jesus says, "Everything is possible for one who believes." Jesus repeatedly emphasized faith—trusting in God's power and promises. Faith is not blind; it's rooted in the reality of who God is. Whether we're facing trials or stepping into the unknown, faith anchors us in Jesus.

The seventh word is *hope*. Jesus is our living hope, promising eternal life and His return. Hebrews 10:23 says, "Let us hold unswervingly to the hope we profess, for he who promised is faithful." Hope in Christ sustains us through life's storms, reminding us that God's plan is greater than our circumstances.

These eight words are more than concepts, they are invitations to live as Jesus did. As a church, let's commit to embracing these words in our daily lives. Let's pray for the Spirit's guidance to make them real in our hearts, homes, and community. May we reflect Christ's character and draw others to Him through these powerful truths. May God Bless you and yours this month!

Jim McLaughlin will present his 28th annual organ recital at Central Trinity UMC, 62 South Seventh Street, Zanesville, Sunday, October 5 - 3:00 p.m. in the church sanctuary. Joining Jim on the recital are Connor Shields and Marge Overdorff for piano and organ music duets. The center of attention for the recital is the church's pipe organ that was built by the E. M. Skinner organ company from Boston, MA in 1924. The Peebles-Herzog Organ Company from Columbus totally refurbished the organ and added several stops to the organ in 1997. Jim also will be featured playing piano solos on the church's 1997 Yamaha C3 grand piano. There will also




Michael and Katlyn Border have started a new podcast called, "Anchored."
