#### "Hold Fast"

"In a world that feels like it's shifting beneath our feet, it's more important than ever to hold fast to our faith and the unchanging truth of God's Word."



In seminary, I learned about John Wesley's Quadrilateral. Basically, what it means is that Wesley believed there were four things that help us understand how to keep our faith strong. These four areas of faith are Scripture, tradition, reason, and experience. These four areas truly help us hold fast in our faith.

You might ask, "What does it mean to hold fast?" The phrase *hold fast* historically comes from the nautical command given to sailors to secure themselves to the ship during storms. Its literal meaning is to hold onto something firmly by gripping it. So what would this meaning have to do with our faith? It means to hold fast, or be steadfast, in our beliefs and values.

We can do this by testing what we believe through Scripture, through the traditions we have, through reasoning, and of course, through our experiences.

Hold fast is an important reminder in today's world. The world often feels like it's shifting beneath our feet—filled with cultural pressures, political unrest, and moral ambiguities. It's more important than ever to anchor ourselves in the unchanging truth of God's Word. It's more important than ever to hold fast and stand firm in your faith.

Paul provides a powerful blueprint for us on holding fast in Ephesians 6:10–18, where he urges believers to "put on the full armor of God, so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes." Here, we're instructed to gird ourselves with truth, righteousness, peace, faith, salvation, and the Word of God, while praying in the Spirit at all times. These verses remind us that to hold fast means being prepared—equipping ourselves daily through prayer, Bible study, and fellowship. When doubts creep in or temptations arise, we don't retreat; we stand our ground; we hold fast with everything we have.

Paul echoes this in 1 Corinthians 16:13: "Be on your guard; stand firm in the faith; be courageous; be strong."

Also in Philippians 4:1, where he writes, "Therefore, my brothers and sisters, you whom I love and long for, my joy and crown, stand firm in the Lord in this way, dear friends!" He ties standing firm to our relationships in the body of Christ, encouraging unity and mutual support. When we stand together, we're stronger—able to endure trials that might overwhelm us alone.

As we begin this month, let us all lean on each other and hold fast with everything we have to the love of Jesus! Remember this: you are not alone.

#### Living ConnecTions

For this issue of ConnecT, we sat down with Jim McLaughlin—our Director of Music, Organist, and longtime leader in Zanesville's music community. Jim has shaped worship through music at Central Trinity and inspired countless students, singers, and audiences throughout the years. We asked him to share a little about his journey, his passion for music, and the role it plays in our faith and community.

#### Q: What first inspired you to pursue music?

A: I have always been surrounded by music at home, church and school. Singing or playing an instrument was just part of our family. Every family get-together always included music along with good food and great conversation. Everyone participated. I soon found myself encouraging others. It seemed logical that music was going to be a major goal in my life.

## Q: Do you remember your very first performance or the first time you played at church?

A: My first time playing at church was a piano and organ prelude to start our church worship service at age 9. Kay Zink played the piano and I was at the Hammond organ. We never had any silent time in the service because our services were broadcast "live" on WSRW am radio each Sunday. I already was playing piano for the children's worship services; but, this was the "big time" playing on the radio!

#### Q: How has music shaped your own faith journey?

A: Music practice is the perfect way for me to shut out the distractions of the world. I am drawn into a meditative spirit and personal prayer time. Music has also brought tremendous



opportunities for spiritual growth. What a privilege to be an instrument of peace when providing music at funerals, weddings and worship!

### Q: What has been one of the most meaningful moments for you as a music director at Central Trinity?

A: The most meaningful moments for me at CT is every time one of our youth comes forward and sings or plays some music to uplift our worship. This is always a time to celebrate.

# Q: You've mentored many students and singers. What do you hope they carry with them after working with you?

A: My hope is that each student feels joy and a calling for service as they use the talents God has given to them.

A: At this point in my life, there are so many former teachers and students that have gone on to be with God who I would love to perform with again. She was my most faithful supporter and even played piano on many of my recitals here at CT into her 90s.
