

Mark 16:9-20 The Appropriate Ending to Mark

- I. Introduction: The ending of Mark has been a disputed passage throughout church history, causing much debate about its inclusion in Mark's Gospel and the New Testament.
- II. The Appropriate Ending to Mark (Mark 16:9-20).
 - A. How many Greek NT manuscripts are there?
 - B. Do the Greek manuscripts contain errors?
 - C. Does this passage really belong at the end of Mark?
 - D. Why does Mark end his Gospel this way?
- **III. Conclusion:** Mark concluded his Gospel with amazement over Jesus, indicating that all those who came into contact with Him were stunned at His words, works, and resurrection.



Questions About: The Appropriate Ending to Mark

- 1. What is the appropriate ending to the Gospel of Mark? Should we accept the longer ending to Mark? (Mark 16:9-20) Should we accept Mark's shorter ending? (Mark 16:1-8)
- 2. What does the Bible claim about itself? (Matt 4:4; 2 Tim 3:16; 1 Thess 2:13) Does your Bible contain God's words? Is your English translation accurate? How do you know if it's accurate?
- 3. How many Greek manuscripts of the New Testament are there? How many copies are in other languages? What did God say about adding to His word? (Deut 4:2; Prov 30:6; Rev 22:18)
- 4. Do the Greek manuscripts contain errors? Does this make the Bible unreliable? How can we be confident that the Bible is inerrant? (**Prov 30:5**) How do the manuscripts guarantee accuracy?
- 5. What two significant additions to the New Testament exist? (John 7:53-8:11; Mark 16:9-20) How can we confidently say they are later additions? What criteria do we use to determine this?
- 6. Does this passage really belong at the end of Mark or not? (Mark 16:9-20) Why does the King James Bible include this passage? Why do the oldest manuscripts not contain this passage?
- 7. What are some reasons why people have argued that this passage is a later addition? (Mark 16:9:20) Where did the writer get this content? Do you believe it belongs in the Bible?
- 8. Why does Mark end his Gospel abruptly? (Mark 16:8) Why is this an appropriate ending? (Mark 1:22, 27; 2:12; 4:41; 5:15, 33, 42; 6:51; 9:6, 15, 32; 10:24, 32; 11:18; 12:17; 15:5)

- 2. Ask God to give you boldness to share the good news of Jesus with others.
