

## **Psalm 24:1-10**

## Let The King Of Glory Come In!

- **I. Introduction:** This psalm was written to welcome the King of glory into Jerusalem, the true King of the earth, who is the rightful Ruler over creation.
- II. Let The King of Glory Come In! (Psalm 24:1-10)
  - A. God's Power Recognized (vv. 1-2).
    - 1. David writes this psalm to celebrate God's rule over the earth and every people group on the planet that exists to glorify His name.
  - B. God's Purity Revealed (vv. 3-6).
    - 1. The psalmist reveals who is worthy to come into the presence of God, since He is obviously more holy than David originally imagined.
  - C. God's Presence Realized (vv. 7-10).
    - 1. David calls for those who guard Jerusalem to open up the gates, because the Lord of glory has finally arrived, the commander of Yahweh's armies.
- **III.** Conclusion: This song celebrates the King of glory, who is the possessor of heaven and earth, the justifier of those who seek Him, and the Commander of heaven's army.



## **Questions About: Let The King Of Glory Come In!**

- 1. Who would you be excited to open your door for if they knocked? What if God knocked on your door? What would you do? Would He be welcomed into your home?
- 2. For what occasion was this Psalm likely written? (2 Sam 6:1-23) What had happened when the Ark of God was moved? (2 Sam 6:1-11) What was David's response to this tragedy?
- 3. What is the question that is repeated in this song? (Psa 24:8, 10) How does David answer this question? What is the first picture of God in Psalm 24? (Psa 24:1-2)
- 4. What is the question that David asks in verse 3? (Psa 24:3-6) How did the incident with Uzzah and the Ark change him? What did it teach him about God's character? (v. 4)
- 5. Who did David say could come into the presence of God? (Psa 24:3-4) What does it mean to have clean hands? (v. 4) What about a pure heart? (v. 4) What else does God require? (v. 4)
- 6. What does David say God will give to those who seek Him? (Psa 24:5-6) How will God give them righteousness? (2 Cor 5:21) What will happen to those who seek Him? (Jer 29:13)
- 7. What did David command the gates to do? (Psa 24:7-10) What question do those inside the city ask? (vv. 8, 10) What is David's answer? (vv. 8, 10) What does it mean?
- 8. Who is the King of glory in the New Testament? (1 Cor 2:8) When did Jesus enter the city the first time as a King? (Matt 21:1-11) When will He enter it again? (Zech 14:1-11)

- 1. Pray that God would give you clean hands and a pure heart today.
- 2. Ask the Lord to help you be prepared for the second coming of Jesus.
