The Dark Tragedy of Calvary

- **I. Introduction:** From a human perspective, the cross appeared to be a divine tragedy, a sad series of events that led to the death of the Messiah at the hands of vile sinners.
- II. The Dark Tragedy of Calvary (Matt 26:1-27:66).
 - A. Malicious Betrayal (Matt 26:14-16, 47-56).
 - 1. Judas appeared to be one of Jesus' most trusted disciples, but in the last moments of His life, Judas betrayed the Savior for a fist full of silver coins.
 - B. Deliberate Injustice (John 18:13-24; Matt 26:57-68; Luke 22:66-71).
 - 1. The Pharisees and Sadducees put Jesus on trial in the most careless way in a complete miscarriage of human justice, bypassing all rules of their courts.
 - C. Political Expediency (Matt 27:1-14; Mark 15:1-5; Luke 23:1-5; John 18:28-38).
 - 1. The Jews brought Jesus to the Roman governor Pilate who crucified Jesus to avoid political difficulties with the Jewish leaders.
 - D. Inhumane Brutality (Matt 27:27-30; Mark 15:16-19).
 - 1. Pilate turned Jesus over to the Roman Praetorian, who abused Jesus to amuse themselves before executing Him like a common criminal.
 - E. Murderous Rage (Matt 27:27-30; Mark 15:16-19).
 - 1. The Romans led Jesus to Calvary, where they crucified Him, making a mockery of His life and executing Him to satisfy their bloodthirsty desires.
- **III. Conclusion:** Jesus was brutally crucified at Calvary according to God's divine plan, which He accomplished so that He could make eternal life available for all humanity.



Questions About: The Dark Tragedy of Calvary

- 1. What is the darkest day in human history? What made the crucifixion of Jesus so tragic? Who did Peter say was responsible for the death of Jesus? (Acts 2:36; 3:12-15)
- 2. How was Jesus maliciously betrayed? (Matt 26:14-16, 47-56) What motivated Judas to give Jesus over to the Jews? (vv. 14-16) How did Judas know where to find Him? (Luke 21:37)
- 3. How was Jesus treated unjustly by the Jews? (John 18:13-24; Matt 26:57-68; Luke 22:66-71) When did they first conspire to kill Him? (John 11:47-50) Why was this ironic?
- 4. How did they try to coerce Jesus to incriminate Himself? (John 18:13-24; Matt 26:57-68; Luke 22:66-71) Why was this illegal? For what crime did they indict Him? (Matt 26:62-68)
- 5. Why did the Jews take Jesus to Pilate? (Matt 27:1-14; Mark 15:1-5; Luke 23:1-5; John 18:28-38) How did Pilate try to get rid of Him? Why did he ultimately agree to crucify Him?
- 6. What did Pilate's soldiers do with Jesus? (Matt 27:27-30; Mark 15:16-20) What was the purpose of dressing Jesus in a robe and crown? How did they torture and humiliate Christ?
- 7. How did the Jews convince Pilate to crucify Jesus? (Matt 27:22-26) Why were victims led through the streets? (Matt 27:31-32) How did the Jews further mock Him? (Matt 27:38-44)
- 8. What miraculous signs accompanied Jesus' crucifixion? (Matt 27:45-54) Why was Jesus' death not a tragedy? (John 10:17-18) How was this God's plan? (Acts 2:23-24)
