### Proverbs 28

*"A destitute leader who oppresses the poor is like a driving rain that leaves no food."*  
-Proverbs 28:3

#### Why is it important that we remember the poor?

**1 The wicked flee when no one is pursuing them, but the righteous are as bold as a lion.**

##### What is the contrast in this verse?

##### Why would a person flee when no one is chasing them?

➤ They have a g\_\_\_\_\_ c\_\_\_\_\_.

In other words, the wicked are defensive even without an accusation. A person who knows they are at fault for something or believes as much may become excessive in attempts to clear their name.

##### How might this apply spiritually in being accountable to God?

- When we are not right with God we tend to a\_\_\_\_\_ Him or go the o\_\_\_\_\_ direction. (Jonah 1:1-3)
- Sadly, this will also take place on the day of God's judgement. (Revelation 6:15-17)
- Those who put their trust in God have a clear c\_\_\_\_\_ and no such fears. (Acts 24:16; Hebrews 13:18)

Lions, in most cases, fear no predators or hostile enemies. They proceed with confidence and assurance because they are bold.

##### What is one thing we can do to have spiritual boldness?

**2 When a land is in rebellion, it has many rulers, but with a discerning and knowledgeable person, it endures.**

### **What causes a nation to be in rebellion?**

- \_\_\_\_\_; Romans 1:18-20; Proverbs 14:34

As a result of their rebellion they find themselves cycling through many rulers, kings, or presidents. This inconsistency in leadership creates chaos which turns the people to electing petty rulers who become tyrants.

The Old Testament reminds us of the struggle when the nation of Israel split. The Northern kingdom of Israel and Southern kingdom of Judah had many kings and rulers which led to their demise when the Assyrian army defeated both the north and south.

### **How should the church respond when the nation is in rebellion?**

We are to be discerning and knowledgeable; God can also bless an individual to provide insight, skillful action, and spiritual perception to turn a nation of sin back to God.

### **3 A destitute leader who oppresses the poor is like a driving rain that leaves no food.**

#### **What is King Solomon comparing?**

**Destitute:** poor man

One would think a poor man who became a leader would have compassion on another poor man, but this is not always the case. Sadly there are poor who oppress the poor. (Matthew 18:23-35)

#### **Notice the comparison**

*like a driving rain that leaves no food.*

Naturally rain nourishes crops, but the difference here is a driving rain which can be harsh, mangle plants and flood the area so that the crops are destroyed.

**4 Those who reject the law praise the wicked, but those who keep the law pit themselves against them.**

**Notice the contrast:**

R\_\_\_\_\_ the law Vs K\_\_\_\_\_ the law; P\_\_\_\_\_ the wicked Vs O\_\_\_\_\_ the wicked

The Mosaic law was intended to expose sin and encourage righteous living. Just before he died, Moses challenged the people of Israel to choose between life and death, good and evil. These choices and consequences still remains today.

If we choose to keep God's commandments, He will bless us. However, If we choose to disobey, He will bring punishment. This proverb reinforces that same idea.
