What is King Solomon comparing in this verse?
> Open R vs. Concealed L
What is reprimand?
Correction, reasoning, rebuke, verbal confrontation that both exposes wrong and appeals for change. It can range from orderly legal argument to sharp prophetic rebuke. It is a form of restoration.
What is love?
An act of the will, showing initiative in covenant loyalty, loyal commitment, family affection and devotion to God.
Why is it better to have someone openly correct us than love us secretly?
✓ The highest form of I must express itself even in times of correction.
✓ Love that hides is w, has no value, professes not to see, and remains silent.

Notice how King Solomon uses this verse to build on the previous verse:
A true friendship sometimes means telling others hard truths, they aren't eager to hear. When correction or rebuke is motivated by sincere love, it is the mark of friendship.
Wounds: A scar from physical impact.
<b>Friend:</b> Close confidant, someone who encourages not discourages; provides genuine support and help in times of need.
What are some indicators of someone is not a true friend?
*Only reach out when they n something    *G about you or others
*Make you feel g for setting boundaries
The main point to remember is, anyone can be insincere and offer affirmation regardless of the situation. Unfortunately, this is a tactic used to disguise ill intent.
