E____ weight In this verse King Solomon is acknowledging the difficulty of overlooking and rising above the constant aggravation from foolish people. Aggravation: Masculine noun; describing an emotional disturbance; vexation, anger, grief, indignation, provocation; a state of inner heat that expresses itself. Biblically speaking, this word applies to God's righteous anger as well as man's sinful anger.

The context determines if it is outward wrath or inward sorrow.

What are some things people do that can cause aggravation?

*Communication offenders: (Constant I , Over t , One uppers)

* Time abusers: (chronic lateness, dragging out m, last minute c)					
*Emotional drainers: (Never admitting w, Passive a, over reacting)					
Most people would rather carry a stone than deal with constant aggravation from a fool.

The main idea here is wrath and anger may inflict pain for a moment, but jealousy can have a long lasting impact.					
Jealousy: raging emotion that often defies reason; envy, hostility, passionate intensity, rivalry; feelings of distrust, resentment, or covetous toward someone or their achievements and advantages.					
What is the difference between God's jealousy for us and the sin of jealousy?					
*God is jealous for our I and d and is possessive of the worship that belongs to Him alone. What He is jealous about belongs to Him. Exodus 20:4-5					
*Being jealous of your neighbor on the other hand is a sin because it involves h, bitterness, and covetousness. It is of the flesh and is at war with the Holy Spirit. Galatians 5:16-17; 19-20

How can we overcome a jealous spirit in our hearts?

- *Acknowledge it (be aware of yourself) *Discover the reason (fear, insecurity)
- *Change your focus (instead of questioning why do they have that?, ask, what can I learn from them?)
- *Be grateful (focus on what is good in your life) * Build what you admire (motivation)
- *Use the Word of God
