Saturday, September 27 · 10am-Noon



ALL SAINTS FOUNDATION

All Saints Foundation received a grant request from Mental Health Connect/Bethlehem Lutheran Church Twin Cities. Mental Health Connect provides education and support to improve access to mental health services and to reduce the stigma associated with it. They requested \$3,000 to provide ten education events between September 1, 2025, and July 1, 2026. The events will occur monthly featuring speakers, authors, and educators to speak to the members of the Mental Health Connect and the surrounding community. Their hope is that the community members, clergy, lay leaders, and attendees will bring back the knowledge to their home congregations and neighborhoods.

All Saints Foundation approved the grant at the July 24, 2025 meeting.
