### A dangerous Christmas

One of the elements of an American Christmas is safety. Everyone is home, inside, usually sitting around a fire while the snow falls. "The children were nestled all safe in their beds...". Sugar plums only dance when it is safe to do so.

But the first Christmas was full of danger. The wise men took a long, dangerous journey. They traveled through dangerous lands, and when they got to Israel, they had to deal with a murderous, psychopathic tyrant. The shepherds risked catastrophe by abandoning their flocks in the fields, to see the baby Jesus. The loss of their sheep would have meant the loss of their ability to feed themselves and others. Mary's trip was risky as well. Riding a donkey and walking for about 100 miles surely puts many strains on a nearly completed pregnancy. Leaving home without hotel reservations isn't the safest thing to do, and the odds-makers in Vegas will not give you good odds on a mother and baby surviving an un-attended birth in a stable/ cave.

The first Christmas was full of danger, full of risk. The greatest risk though, was taken by God. He bet it all on people. He risked Himself on us and for us. He risked it all, all His love on us and Jesus. What if we rejected Jesus? What if the love of God for all humanity and for each individual human was spurned? What if the people he came to save rejected him? What if Jesus died?

All that and more happened, didn't it? And yet here we are, Christians celebrating the birth of Jesus. In spite of (or because of?) all that happened, God's great plan came to fruition. (Take that, odds-makers.)

I hope you will not play it safe at Christmas, loving only those who loved you first, giving gifts to only those who deserve them, or who you know will give you something too. It is apparent (from the biblical account, not your TV) that Christmas is a time for engaging in extravagantly risky behavior. Doing dangerous things like loving your fellow man, whoever it is, or giving extravagant gifts to people who have never done a thing for you and you will never see again. Christmas is a time for sharing the love of God and that, as we have seen, is some of the riskiest behavior anyone can engage in. Risk telling the story of you and Jesus to someone who may not receive it. Take a chance on giving without any guarantee of getting back. Take a chance on someone who doesn't deserve it. You'll be in VERY good company if you do.

Have a merry dangerous Christmas.


#### **More Christmas events**

### Keith's Konnections

"And there were in the same country shepherds abiding in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night. And, lo, the angel of the Lord came upon them, and the glory of the Lord shone round about them; and they were sore afraid. And the angel said unto them, Fear not: for, behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy, which shall be to all people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, which is Christ the Lord. And this shall be a sign unto you; Ye shall find the babe wrapped in swaddling clothes, lying in a manger." (Luke 2:8-12 KJV) The news that the angels proclaimed did not make the news on CNN, CBS, ABC, NBC, nor did it even make the news on FOX, Facebook, Instagram or the Bethlehem Battalion. There were probably other babies born on that day in Bethlehem, so no one in town was aware of the great gift God had just presented to mankind. This was a private moment between Joseph and Mary and with the angels who heralded the birth of the one who was to save the nations. It is interesting to note also that the proclamation was not made to kings and kingdoms, to the elite and rich, nor was it made to the religious leaders of the day. The proclamation was first given to the lowliest of the low, the meekest of the meek and the most helpless of the hopeless.

Why would God not proclaim this Good News to those in authority rather than proclaiming it to those stinking, social outcast shepherds? Simply put, God's greatest gift of all time was given for ALL people, both the rich and the poor, male and female, educated and ignorant, Jews and Gentiles alike. The God who rules the universe was aware that, even though the nation of Israel had long awaited the coming Messiah, no one could conceive that the Messiah would come in the form of a helpless, defenseless, crying baby, born in a feed bunker in the basement of the inn which refused them. This was NOT the way that the Jews had envisioned their Redeemer Messiah to come. He was to be a KING, riding in to town with a vast army to overthrow the oppression of the Roman government. Yet, He remained meek throughout His ministry and the religious leaders did not comprehend that the Kingdom He was going to set up was not of this world, but rather a Heavenly Kingdom with His Father.

This is still the Good News for today, and especially this time of year, we need to be reminded that the greatest gift given to all who choose to accept it is eternal life in this new kingdom in Heaven. "In my Father's house are many mansions: if it were not so, I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you. And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again, and receive you unto myself: that where I am, there ye may be also." (John 14:2-3 KJV) This gift is still open to all who will accept it. Let us not get caught up in the commercialism of this season, but take time to reflect on the GREATEST GIFT OF ALL TIME!!

May God richly bless you and yours this Christmas season and remember that HE IS THE REASON FOR THE SEASON. If we remove Christ from Christmas, all we have left is "mas" or (more). 
