Two life-changing opportunities

There are two important events coming up for FBC that you should be aware of and that you should be a part of. They are our mission trip (June 18-23) and 4X four.

I just got back from an eight hundred mile round trip to McAllen so I could better know what to tell you about the mission trip. The accommodations are very nice. The price for fifteen meals and six nights of rest at a newly refurbished Baptist encampment is only \$180.00. The park where we will teach VBS in air-conditioned comfort and teach basketball and soccer to children is spacious and nice. We will also have the opportunity to teach parenting classes if we have the personnel. But I didn't need to go eight hundred miles to tell you why you should go on this mission

You should go because you need to go. You should go because you need to spend a week with people from this church that you need to know better. You should go because there are people in this church who need to know you better. You should go because your kids need to see that their parents want to share the love of God with others. You should go because you need to see what incredible servants your kids are, and how they are growing in the Lord. You should go because you need to stop talking about missions and do missions. You should go and see how desperately people need to hear the Good News. You should go and see spiritual and material poverty of a magnitude you don't want to look at. You should go because you need to sacrifice something you think is really important for something Jesus has already said is really important. You should go and get your eyes opened. You should go and get your heart opened. You should go because you have never gone before. You should go because you never fail to go. You should go because you haven't gone in a while. You should go. Really, you should go.

The other opportunity you should be a part of is 4X four. This is a relationship evangelism tool that is ridiculously easy to use. We will be starting to learn the how and why of it very soon. I cannot over-emphasize to you how important this can be to our church. The days of church growth being based on the children of members and Baptists moving in from another town (or church) are DEAD. Transfer growth is just swapping pieces of the pie, and the pie is disappearing faster than you will believe. We must return to biblical church growth, which is bringing the lost to Christ, not swapping or stealing sheep from another flock. 4X four will give anyone of any age a very simple process to share their faith. I encourage you in the strongest way possible to come and learn how easy this tool is to master and to then put to work in your life.

We have had a year of learning some truths about ourselves. It's time we faced the future and begin to take hold of the biblical tasks of missions and evangelism—discipleship—and get serious about our spiritual health, our spiritual growth and the spiritual needs of our little corner of the world and see if we can't leverage that into a vision for the bigger world out there.

I have told you what you should do. I strongly encourage you to remember that I haven't told you anything that Jesus hasn't already said you must do. The opportunities are being laid out before you. You really should take advantage of them.



Keith's Konnections

How's your heart? By this, I don't mean are you having heart problems, etc. By this I mean, how is your heart toward other people? Are you concerned about those around you and their faith condition? Greg Wallace, author of the 4XFour Evangelism training says, "It is one thing to be lost, but it is another thing to be lost and know that no one is looking for you!" How many lost/unchurched people are in our communities and no one is really looking for them? In the average Texas community, some 60%-65% of the people are lost. AND NO ONE IS LOOKING FOR THEM!! Therefore, in a town of 5,000, there are approximately 3,000-3,250 people in that community that do not know God, and our hearts are such that we seem to be unconcerned about these people. The number one killer of American Christianity today is APATHY. How many churches do you know that baptized NO ONE last year or maybe just a small percentage? The numbers will astound you, if you look at the statistics. Approximately 27% of Texas Baptist churches last year baptized NO ONE; another 25% baptized from 1-5 people; another 20 something per cent baptized 6-10 people, and only about 10% of our Texas churches baptized more than 10 people. Folks, it seems that we have forgotten about the Great Commission found in Matthew 28:19-20, "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." (NIV)

Maybe what our Texas churches need today is an old fashioned revival, not for those **outside** the church, but for those **inside** the church. We need to be revived, regenerated and rejuvenated in order to do the work that the Lord has impressed upon us. We have challenges all around us, we see lost people all around us, and we have opportunities all around us, and yet we seem to be oblivious to all this and we are content with "the way things are!" We can change the way things are if we will commit to sharing our faith one on one with someone who may need to hear the Gospel of Jesus Christ. I would encourage all our churches to cast a new vision for 2017 that they will do more than ever before, that they will reach out to people in their community more so than before, and that we make a commitment to BE ALL THAT GOD WANTS US TO BE!
