

Community Snapshot Moments that Shine Beyond Our Walls

Sunday evening's Trunk or Treat became a beautiful opportunity to live out our mission of welcome and hospitality. It was a night filled with laughter and light, reflecting our calling—to welcome with joy, love our neighbor, and build community wherever God gathers us.

Around 60 children, most from our surrounding community, made their way through a pathway of 14 creatively decorated trunks while our youth served nearly 100 cups of hot chocolate. Among the many displays, one carried a full Cook Out theme, with participants dressed as fries, a hot dog, a hamburger, ketchup, and a cook who brought the fast-food fun to life.

A cardboard Frankenstein drew smiles as children were invited to reach into his "nose" for candy. One little girl stood before him, torn between caution and curiosity, until courage quietly rose within her and she reached in to claim her prize. Courage won the moment as she pulled out the candy, studied it with wide-eyed wonder, and—after a moment of reflection—placed it in her brother's bucket.

As if the night needed more surprises, we witnessed a man riding on the back of a T-Rex. The children were fascinated. Their curiosity grew as they tried to figure out how the costume worked. For a moment, it looked like Jurassic Park had come to the church parking lot—only this time with candy instead of chaos: the Treat-osaurus Rex.

As families headed home, the night's joy went with them. Trunk or Treat became a memory children will replay as they sort their candy and share stories of favorite games and costumes. Moments like these stir gratitude for a church willing to be visible beyond its walls to embrace others.

Along the way, we shared information about upcoming opportunities for families to stay connected with our church community, including our Christmas sermon series beginning after Thanksgiving and our children's Christmas event. The evening was made possible by many hands and generous hearts—a reminder that ministry happens best when we serve together in joy. Beyond candy and costumes, the event reflected our call to share God's love with those around us.



New Study Alert

"Everyone Must Eat" — A New Adult Study on Food, Faith, and Community Action

We invite you to a new four-week class called "Everyone Must Eat", a spiritually grounded and justice-minded conversation about food insecurity in Cleveland County beginning 10/29 in the conference room.

Every Saturday, our Open Table Ministry feeds over 200 people with a hot meal and groceries—offering connection, care, and dignity. And yet, I in 6 of our neighbors in Cleveland County still struggle to access enough food. What more can we do—not just to feed people, but to build a more just and sustainable food system for all?

This class, co-led by Pastor David and Laura Lombardi, invites us to reflect deeply and act boldly over four sessions.

This isn't a top-down teaching series. It's not a lecture, but a lab for listening, learning, and leading together. We'll ask hard questions, share personal stories, and begin shaping practical responses to food insecurity right here in Shelby. If you're looking to connect your faith with real-life community impact, this class is for you.
