It is a great feeling to support the outreach, mission and ministry of Central United Methodist Church. We have much to appreciate and to be thankful for as we approach Thanksgiving.

For our church's 2026 Stewardship campaign, we have received 53 pledges(estimates of giving), totaling \$509,972. Our goal is 100 cards and an amount at least equal to our 2025 Operating Budget of \$801,000.

Thank you to all who have pledged so far and thanks to all who have been generous supporters of our mission in previous years. We have had 9 new pledges and encourage you to estimate your giving at a level you are comfortable with for 2026 if you have not pledged before.



Youth Lock In & "Skip A Meal, Donate A Meal"

The youth spent the night at the church Friday. During their lock in, they learned more about the unhoused from Todd Bolin and how food insecurity impacts our community. The youth shared a poverty meal and watched The Pursuit of Happyness. Saturday morning, everyone got up early to help Boy Scout Troop 104 collect donations for "Scouting for Food". We collected 1,914 lbs of food donations that were then weighed, sorted, and put on the shelves in the PAC.


Disciple Class


