# **Letting Go of Control**

When my daughter, Brooke, was a baby, she used to stand in her crib, reach out her little arms, and say, "Hold you."

As a brand-new parent and an eager educator, I saw this as a perfect teaching moment. Gently, I corrected her:

"Brooke, you're using the second-person singular objective personal pronoun—you—when what you mean is the first-person singular objective personal pronoun—me. So you should say, 'Hold me.'"

She looked at me with a big, proud smile, and my heart swelled. I was confident she understood. I told myself, Wait for it... wait for it...

And sure enough, she reached her arms out again, smiled even bigger, and said, "Hold you. Hold you."

I laugh about it now, but here's what I've come to realize: she didn't need a grammar lesson. She needed to be held.

There's a subtle form of control that hides in our desire to be helpful. We think we're teaching, guiding, improving—when maybe the holier response would be to simply receive the person and the moment just as they are.

Are there areas in your life where you're tempted to correct when what's really needed is connection?

That moment in the crib wasn't about language. It was about love.

Why is it so hard to let the moment be what it is, without trying to fix it?



Sometimes our need to instruct becomes a barrier to connection. Sometimes our desire to be right keeps us from being present. Sometimes we forget that the people in front of us don't always need answers—they need arms.

I wonder: What would change if we saw the people around us not as problems to be solved, but as souls to be embraced?


