Behind A Backpack

The Hallway Class has been fortunate to have leaders from different ministries at CUMC share about their programs with our Sunday School class. Sitting together in the classroom, we've heard stories and asked questions that gave us a glimpse into the heartbeat of our church. Friends from Open Table, Soup Group, the Congregational Care Team, and the Pack-a-Trunk Ministry have shared how their work quietly meets needs and builds community. This past Sunday, the Backpack Ministry shared about their work during Sunday School, giving us a look at the difference a simple bag of food can make in a child's life.

A backpack can hold more than books. Sometimes it carries the weight of worry. A child may be wondering if there will be enough food at home over the weekend. According to the Feeding Kids Cleveland County website, a local nonprofit, 1 in 3 children in our county are facing food insecurity. That means right here in our own neighborhoods, many students begin the weekend unsure if they will have enough to eat.

That is why our Backpack Ministry matters. Each week, our church provides 12 bags of food for Shelby Middle School and 10 bags for North Shelby High School. These bags quietly slip into the hands of students who need them most, giving them nourishment and the assurance that someone cares.

As the new school year begins, let us remember the students and families we serve through this ministry. The items we collect, often listed in the newsletter or bulletin, may seem small, but together they add up to a gift of hope and strength for a child. Each ministry update has reminded us that God's work is alive in so many forms, and we are grateful to be part of it together.

We can all make a difference in a child's weekend and in their life by bringing items listed in the newsletter or bulletin, offering prayers, or simply spreading the word. Every small contribution helps a child in need.

Log Cabin Award



Quilting has long been identified as an arts and crafts endeavor closely linked to mountain culture. Of necessity those who settled in these areas needed the warmth that a quilt provided, and they could be made from scraps and remnants of cloth. There was a functionally and economy to the craft that suited life on the frontier, while beauty and creativity were sewn into what remained of worn clothing and sewing scraps.

This design is the Log Cabin block. The center red square represents the hearth fire and the heart of the home. The block

features an array of 'logs' or strips of fabric that build upon one another in a circular motion, similar to the way log cabins were once built. The strips are light on one side of the diagonal and dark on the opposite side signifying both the beauty and the challenges of life itself.

This quilt block has been crafts with love and given to Central United Methodist Church, Shelby, N.C., on Sunday, August 10, 2025, with sincere appreciation for your continuing gifts of service to those affected by Hurricane Helene. In our darkest hour you have been the hands and feet of Christ to those in need, helping us to rebuild lives and homes in our Blue Ridge Mountains.

ground and constructed garden boxes to initiate

a garden project that will provide fresh produce to an area severely affected by Hurricane Helene. In contrast, the girls remained indoors and assisted with a similar endeavor to our Open Table ministry. This small church has dedicated the past 11 months to serving a hot meal to the community from 12-6pm, Tuesdays-Saturdays. The consistently serve an average of 173 meals daily and have a small pantry that provides groceries for individuals to take home. It was amazing to see the huge impact a small congregation of about 20 people and a handful of regular volunteers can make.




