The Wonders of Christmas

I can't believe that it is already December and almost the end of another year. The theme that we are using for this Advent season is the Wonders of Christmas. We are looking at the themes of Love, Peace, Joy, Hope, and His birth. As we have been going through God's story the past few months, I have been reminded so often of His love for His people and creation. His people constantly fall away from Him, turn to other gods, and yet He is still right there, welcoming them back and walking with them. He so loves His people.

In reading through the Nativity story and all that lead up to the birth of our Savior, I am always amazed that God made the first move. He sent His Son to this broken, fallen world. The disciple named John wrote some bold and shaping realities about the love we can experience because of the love God expresses towards people. Note these two verses that John wrote on the wonder of God's love.

"We love because God first loved us." 1 John 4:19

"For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life." John 3:16

The love of God for people so compelled Him to make the first move in manifesting His love towards people that He came in the form of a baby. The prophecies called Him Immanuel, which means, "God with us." The God who loves us is the God who is with us in the person of Jesus. He came near to us because He wanted a relationship with us that would enable us to love Him back like He desires to be loved by His most precious creation: humans. God made the move to choose Mary as the mother of His only begotten Son in part because she could be trusted with such a task but also because of the way Mary must have loved God with all her heart, soul, mind, and strength. She loved God back with her life. God chose her to be the loving mother of Jesus even though it was a startling moment when the message was conveyed to her by the angel Gabriel. Mary, who was called "highly favored" by Gabriel, must have been one who engaged in the prayers of her people toward the God who loved her and loved her people.

Whether you are a first-century Jewish teenage girl trying to understand how you just were chosen by God to be the mother of the Messiah or you are a twenty-first-century person trying to figure out life with God in your circumstances, know that God loves you this Christmas. He is not afraid of your curiosities or your anxieties that crop up in life through the various seasons and circumstances of change. He knows where you have been, where you are, and where you are headed. He has a plan for your life and wants that plan to include heart-to-heart communication with Him as your Creator. He wants you to call on Him with all your questions and your doubts. He will answer you and show you the next steps as you walk faithfully with Him through this season of life. a. Balance Sheet

- I did not have to transfer funds from savings to cover expenses in October!
- CD with Bell Investments (\$130,000) is due in November. I will roll it over and cash out the interest and put in the Endowment Tithe account. I will know the interest amount later this month.

b. Operating Income/Expenses

- General Offering and interest for October was \$11,012.33.
- Operating expenses for October were \$13,404.95.
- Operating expenses exceeded operating income by \$2,392.62 for the month of October. This YTD shortage is \$14,675.07.
- This report is run to only show operating income and expenses to accurately reflect operations without any large expenses that are covered with other funds. The other income and expenses, such as capital improvements, missions, etc. are shown in the budget to actual statement.

c. Budget vs Actual

- Offering is short of the budget YTD of \$74,903.91.
- The main Capital Improvements expenses year to date are made up of the following:
 - Basement remodel project: approximately \$37,000
 - Fire inspection and replacing alarm panel: approximately \$2,500
 - New water softener & install: \$1,700
 - o Audio equipment: \$3,100
 - o Plumbing: \$700
- Endowment tithes (\$52,000) that have been paid year to date:
 - Heart of Clay: \$10,000
 - Lutheran Island Camp: \$12,500 (\$2,500 of this is from Lutheran Extension Fund)
 - FMSC: \$10,000LAMP: \$10,000
 - Moorhead School Homeless: \$10,000
 - Down Home: \$2,000
- Miscellaneous Designations year to date:
 - Giving Hearts Day Match: \$2,500
 - o LIC Adopt A Counselor: \$5,000
