## The Great Wait: Delight and Discernment in the Second Coming "The Blessing"

Thessalonians 5:23–28 October 5, 2025 The Lord's Day Morning

Each worship service in our church and in thousands of churches around the world will end today with a blessing or benediction (lit. speaking good things). The tradition has biblical roots in the Old Testament (Numbers 6:24–26) and continues in the New Testament, as we see in this morning's text.

What is a blessing? The blessing is a brief statement assuring God's *gathered* people of his steadfast love for them, encouraging them to *grow* in knowing, loving, obeying, and exalting Jesus Christ as they are dismissed from public worship to *go* out into the world.

1. God's peace assures us he will give us the spiritual we need for adversity (23).	
2. God's faithfulness assures us we will make gradual in becoming like Jesus (24).	
3. God's commands assure us we are responsible to the means of grace (25–27).	
4. God's grace assures us that his enabling goes with us when we leave here (28).
