Global Missions

Montego Bay, Jamaica

Team Type: Encouragement (Senior Adults)

We are returning to Jamaica for a third time! We will again take a team of adults age 55+ to minister in local communities in the Montego Bay and Falmouth areas. This team will do ministry and provide encouragement in nursing homes, orphanages, drug rehabilitation centers and schools, along with doing grocery distribution in poverty-stricken communities. We will also have the privilege to participate in several Jamaican Assembly of God church services.

Rajasthan, India

Team Type: Vocational Training (Adults)

Taking a stand against sex trafficking is a priority of CLA. In support of this, we have taken several teams over the past four years to Ashagaon Village (Village of Hope). This life-changing organization is helping women rebuild their lives after being rescued from the sex trafficking industry by teaching them critical vocational skills and sharing the hope of Jesus. This team will provide training in a variety of important vocations, such as baking, hairdressing, leadership and computer training – **or any valuable skills that our team members may have experience in.**





Global Missions

King's Castle, El Salvador

Team Types: Evangelism, Medical, Construction (Adults)

King's Castle – El Salvador has held a special place in our hearts for many years. In fact, some of our church family's most life-changing moments have taken place here. Our host missionaries are witnessing a powerful move of God in this country, and we are thrilled for the opportunity to continue to be a part of it.

- **Evangelism:** This team will share the Gospel message with children and their families in neighborhoods around the country through engaging skits, games, personal testimonies and food distribution.
- **Medical:** A variety of medical professionals, including doctors, nurses, dentists and pharmacists, are needed to serve the needs of the less fortunate in local villages. Limited space is also available for non-medical team members who can assist the medical team and share the love of Jesus through prayer.
- **Construction:** Those with moderate to advanced construction skills are needed to help improve the lodging and ministry training facilities of King's Castle, where they host and minister to thousands of people each year. Anticipated projects include painting, facility repairs and basic plumbing.



Skopje, North Macedonia

Team Type: Construction (Adults)

We will be partnering with our missionaries, Tim and Ellenora Bentley, to help finish the construction of a church building for a thriving Macedonian church in Strumica, a town outside the capital city of Skopje. This church has been rapidly growing and is in dire need of a larger worship space. Construction of their new church building stalled during COVID and, with their economy struggling to rebound, they have been unable to restart the project. We will also have the opportunity to assist with outreach at a Roma church in the nearby town of Prilep. The Roma people are a very marginalized people group.

“When first considering whether or not to go on a missions trip, Pastor Kristian told me that two things happen when you go. First, you see life differently – you start appreciating your life more and become more grateful. Second, you will not want to stop going on missions trips! I have participated in seven of them and have three more scheduled. I promise they will change your life!”

Global Missions

Morogoro, Tanzania (East Africa)

Team Type: Medical (Adults)

Our partnership with Bethel Revival Temple in Morogoro and the Tanzania Assemblies of God is long-term and far-reaching. A variety of medical professionals, including doctors, nurses, dentists and pharmacists, are needed to serve the needs of the less fortunate in the region surrounding our host church. Much of this community has no electricity or running water, and many suffer with illnesses stemming from unsafe water and food sources. There is also space for a limited number of non-medical team members who can assist the medical team and share the love of Jesus through prayer. This team will also minister to children in a local orphanage who desperately need to experience the hope of Jesus.

"I love sharing the Good News with people and believe God placed this trip on my heart to get me out of my comfort zone. He has recently been speaking to my spirit to trust Him more. I was originally concerned about finances because I recently resigned from my job due to some family challenges. But God still provided because He uses all people who are willing to surrender their will to His. As I trust Him more, I am growing and not relying on myself for what He wants me to do."

Tsukuba, Japan

Team Type: Evangelism & Outreach (Adults)

This will be our first missions team to Japan, and the need is great – only 0.5% of the Japanese people are Christians. Our team will help the international church in Tsukuba prepare for their major Christmas outreach. We will help hang thousands of Christmas lights outside the church and distribute invitations to a Christmas light extravaganza. In Japanese culture, this kind of event draws large crowds and gives the church an opportunity to connect with many people they would never have the chance to connect with otherwise.

Sumba, Indonesia

Team Type: Arts & Sports Camp (Adults)

The island of Sumba is steeped in animism, animal sacrifice and idol worship. The House of Hope is a youth mentoring and discipleship complex that was established over 20 years ago by our longtime missionary partner, Doug Hollis, who devoted many years to sharing the love of Jesus on this beautiful island.

We will be taking a multifaceted team to partner with newly appointed missionaries, Mike and Diane Masse, to conduct an **Arts Camp** (music, drama, dance and visual art) and a **Pickleball Camp**. The Arts Camp students will present a mini musical production, and the Pickleball Camp participants will play in an exhibition tournament to show their families what they learned. This approach builds a bridge with the community and invests in the lives of the next generation.



Global Missions

Bangkok, Thailand

Team Type: Prayer, Evangelism & Outreach (Adults)

Last year was the first time we embarked on a trip like this, and it is one we will never forget. Our team will return to Thailand, a country that is steeped in demonic oppression. It is very gripped in Buddhist religious practices and needs a spiritual breakthrough from the strongholds that exist. This small strategic prayer team will undergo an intensive prayer journey, praying strategically for and in some of the most revered Buddhist temples in the country. We will also minister to children through kids' programs.

Two prerequisites: (1) Participate in a training course based on the book *Change the Map: Impacting the Buddhist World through Prayer and Action*. (2) Go through an interview process.

“My time in Thailand contained many God moments, including one at the second temple we went to. We were praying the prayer points our missionary host Mark had given us, and the storehouse next to the temple holding all the offerings for the idols came crashing to the ground. No one was hurt, and we watched God’s glory come down with an immediate answer to prayer by literally bringing the house down.”

Northern Asia

Team Type: Sports & English as a Second Language (ESL) Camp (Adults)

Our team of coaches, English teachers and others will once again run a Sports & English as a Second Language Camp at an international school we support. The team will conduct basketball, baseball, soccer and cheerleading clinics, as well as teach English utilizing music, storytelling, collaborative reading and other creative teaching methods. This will serve as a unique and creative way to build relationships and spread the Gospel in this very challenging region of the world.

Domestic Missions

Glacier Bible Camp | Hungry Horse, Montana

Team Type: Construction (Adults)

Thousands of kids are profoundly impacted in their faith every year at faith-based camps across the country. Each summer at Glacier Bible Camp, many are filled with the Holy Spirit, called into ministry and drawn into a closer walk with Jesus. This camp also hosts a weeklong camp for more than 1,000 Native American teens from reservations across the Pacific Northwest. Our team will be helping to prepare the camp for the many weeks of summer ministry they do with a variety of renovation and construction projects to ensure it is ready to welcome and serve the kids well. Anticipated projects include painting, plumbing and basic facility repairs.

Hope for McDowell | Jolo, West Virginia

Team Type: Construction (Adults)

We are returning to Jolo, where we have built a wonderful relationship with Pastor Charlie and Sharon Rose with the Family Worship Center, Hope for McDowell organization and local community. Over the past few years, we have assisted with various building and renovation projects, as well as tackled much-needed home repairs for residents of McDowell County. This county is one of the poorest in the nation, and the need for such work is great. Skilled construction team members, as well as those with basic to advanced renovation abilities, are needed.

“My life was changed as a result of this trip because it made me realize that asking or praying for something is just half of the equation. If I’m not still and quiet, I’m going to miss God’s message because the Word says that God doesn’t typically speak to you in a thundering voice, but many times it’s the whisper of the Holy Spirit. When we fill our lives with busyness and don’t make time for that quiet time, we’re likely to miss what God has for us.”

Student Missions

King's Castle, El Salvador

Team Type: Outreach (High School | Grades 9-12)

King's Castle - El Salvador continues to witness a mighty move of God in the surrounding region. Members of this team will share the Gospel message with children and their families in neighborhoods around the country through skits, songs, dance, various games and personal testimonies.

LA Dream Center Los Angeles, CA

Team Type: Outreach (College Age | Age 18-25)

This team will be working with those on the streets, bringing hope and resources to those without food, clothes or families. This part of LA has historically been broken. We are going to share Jesus with those who are experiencing deep poverty and addiction by linking arms with the Dream Center. The LA Dream Center was founded more than 30 years ago.





Philly Dream Center Philadelphia, PA

Team Type: Outreach (Middle School | Grades 6-8)

Pastors David and Shirrie Dominguez and their team are making a significant difference in the city of Philadelphia. They offer a wide variety of programs to reach kids and families in the city, as well as reach those who are gripped by the opioid crisis. This team will participate in SHINE, the Dream Center's sidewalk Sunday School ministry, and VIP, which offers relief for low-income families, persons struggling with addiction and others living without hope.

"What compelled me to go on this missions trip was to be part of helping a community and bringing people closer to Jesus. I was nervous about what I was walking into, but also so excited to see what God would do in my life. I met a girl named Carrie on the street, and after we interacted with her, I could feel the Holy Spirit working through her."

Local Missions

Our community has many opportunities to make a difference, yet we can't tackle them all. Our goal? To have the greatest impact by partnering with local, like-minded organizations.

Here is a snapshot of where we will focus locally in 2026.

Mission 10 Work Days

Typically held on the fourth Saturday of the month (March through October), we have designated these days to send a team of volunteers to serve on-site at a local missions partner.

Students

We will provide backpacks and school supplies to local students, as well as partner with a local faith-based after-school program.

Homeless

We will continue to share opportunities with our church family to provide food, other necessities and prayer for those experiencing homelessness in our community.

Jubilee Day (June 18, 2026)

CLA will once again sponsor the event's Petting Zoo and have a booth with fun, free kids' activities to bless and connect with local individuals and families.

Additional Opportunities

Several additional priorities include expanding our impact for Jesus in Silver Spring Township, expanding our prison ministry efforts and prayerfully considering new endeavors where the Lord will have us focus.

"I felt joy in serving God and contributing to the compassionate cause for women in need. FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

GLOBAL MISSIONS TRIPS

How soon ahead of a trip should I register?

The registration deadline is three months ahead of the trip dates. In addition to completing the online application and forms, a \$250 non-refundable deposit is due upon approval of your application for the trip.

When are the registration fees due?

There are three primary deadlines for trip participants: a \$250 deposit is due upon application approval; 50 percent of the total trip cost is due six weeks ahead of the trip dates; and the total trip cost (balance) must be paid in full prior to trip departure.

Are there fundraising opportunities for trip participants?

Within Managed Missions (the missions trip management software that CLA uses), participants may set up a personal fundraising page. Please note – It is the responsibility of each participant to raise the required trip fees.

Who handles organizing trip logistics?

All travel logistics/details – including booking flights, organizing transportation to and from the airport, and securing all details while on the trip – are handled by CLA's missions staff.

What does the trip fee cover, and do I need extra money beyond this fee?

The trip fee covers the exact cost of flights, transportation, lodging, travel insurance, food/meals and any other trip-related expenses, such as sightseeing events. The trip fee covers everything, with the exception of money to buy souvenirs, personal snacks and meals on the travel days.

What travel documents are needed, and who obtains them?

All participants of a global trip must have a current passport that will not expire within six months of his/her departure date. If a participant does not have a passport, he/she must have applied for a passport before registering for a trip. Our missions staff will gladly answer any questions and assist with applying for any needed special travel visas.

What other prerequisites are needed?

Participants must have regularly attended CLA for at least six months, as well as have completed all background clearances that are required for all CLA volunteer opportunities. Additionally, participants must attend the pre-trip meetings.

How are lodging accommodations handled?

Participants should plan to share a room (double occupancy minimum) because we make every effort to steward our missions funds well. However, if a private room is needed, this could be a possibility with an extra fee.

Please note: For domestic trips, a government-issued Real ID or passport is required.

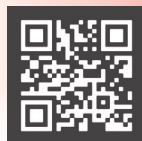
